Rejoice!

This, the fourth Sunday of Lent, is called by that name because of the beginning of the opening antiphon for today's Mass: "*Laetare* Jerusalem," which is translated, "Rejoice, Jerusalem!" And we do rejoice. We are at the midway point of this season of penance, looking forward to the celebration of the holiest week of the Christian year. Just as we do the third Sunday of Advent (*Gaudete* Sunday), today the priest wears "Rose" vestments. Let us, indeed, be joyful that we are sons and daughters of God through our baptism.

Solemnity of St. Joseph, Husband of Mary

This coming Friday, March 19th, with all the Church, we celebrate the Solemnity of St. Joseph, Husband of Mary. It's a time to thank God for St. Joseph, and to look to him for his intercession for us, for our families, and for the Church as a whole. Pope Francis declared this to be the Year of St. Joseph, and we are especially blessed that the 19th falls this year on a Friday, so this Friday is not a day of abstinence. On the contrary, it is a day to feast! May all fathers look to Joseph and all of us give thanks to him for the love he showed to Jesus and Mary.

Magnificat Booklet *Nine Days with St. Joseph*

As an added aid to devotion to St. Joseph, we have purchased some of these booklets. They were available beginning Thursday, March 11th for those who wished to use them as a Novena progressing to the Solemnity, but they can also be used anytime one wishes to do a Novena to St. Joseph. Together we ask, "St. Joseph, pray for us!"

40 Days for Life Campaign Continues

40 Days for Life campaign is ongoing. This year the site of prayers is the Planned Parenthood facility in Frandor. I am grateful for the strong commitment to pray and serve among our parishioners, and invite all of us to keep this in our prayers throughout Lent. Padre Pio Statue

The Church of the Resurrection will be hosting a life-size statue of Young St. Pio that is making a one-time tour of churches in the region before being installed on Catholic Healthcare International's Casa USA campus in Howell, MI, where he will remain permanently to greet devoted pilgrims & his spiritual children. The one of a kind statue is based on one of the few photos of St. Pio when he was younger. On September 7th, 1910, in the first year of his ministry, Young Padre Pio received the first stigmata while sitting beneath a magnificent tree in Piana Romana, Italy. St. Pio shared the experience in a letter to his spiritual advisor, "In the center of my hands, a red spot appeared, about the size of a coin, and with it, an intense pain in the soles of my feet."

This pain in his hands and feet was the first occurrence of the stigmata, even though they were not visible at the time. It was not until September 20, 1918, that Padre Pio received the visible stigmata after he celebrated morning Mass.

Visiting this statue is to be a part of the history of the pilgrim site coming to Howell, MI where he will be placed under a magnificent tree near the planned Adoration Chapel, a replica of St. Pio's chapel in San Giovanni Rotondo.
