The Incarnation Is Our Hope . . .

... and so we celebrate the Solemnity of the Annunciation. In the heart of this Lenten season, we recall that March 25, nine months before Christmas, is when our hope for salvation came to earth. This coming Thursday, we remember and celebrate the "Yes" of Mary, the young maiden, who conformed her will to that of the Father in heaven. Mary said, "Be it done to me according to your word." And it was. She conceived by the Holy Spirit, and became the Mother of Hope, the Mother of Mercy, the Mother of Jesus, the Mother of God! What a great gift it is to remember the joy of the Incarnation as we anticipate the culmination of Christ's life on earth, his Passion, Death, and Resurrection.

Becoming an "Inviting Parish"

One of my desires for the Church of the Resurrection is that we would become more and more comfortable sharing our faith with family and friends, in nonjudgmental, winsome ways. Indeed, it's not obvious (or easy) to share the faith, but it all begins with prayerfulness. Do you have family or friends who don't practice their faith, are dealing with serious challenges, seem to be frustrated with life, or are seeking for the answers to the meaning of life? If so, the first step is praying for them. Ask the Lord for a sense of peace about inviting them to join you during Holy Week, or at some occasion during the season of Easter. As we anticipate Holy Week, let's keep each other in prayer, as well as those that the Lord is placing on our hearts this Lent and Easter. God bless you all.

Kervgma

Last weekend, in my homilies, I talked about the power and importance of knowing and sharing the "Kerygma," which is the Greek word for initial proclamation (of the Gospel). I pulled some information from a great website (catholicmissionarydisciples.com). The information I took was from their blog. This short summary of the four spiritual laws and the seven elements of the Kerygma is very valuable:

Four Elements of Kerygma - A:

- 1. the loving plan of God for humanity
- 2. sin and its consequences, especially separation from God:
- 3. God's answer to our problem in the sending of his Son for our salvation
- 4. The response this grace calls forth from every person: to repent, believe in Jesus, & be baptized

Four Elements of Kerygma - B:

- 1. God made us for relationship with Him.
- 2. We sinned and then broke the relationship we were intended to have.
- 3. Jesus (who is God and man) came to heal that relationship, through sacrificing his life, rising again, and giving us the Church.
- 4. We have the opportunity to respond, by choosing to have Jesus be our Lord and Savior.

Seven Elements of the Kerygma:

- 1. God loves you and has plan for your life.
- 2. Sin will destroy you.
- 3. Christ Jesus died to save you.
- 4. Repent and believe the Gospel.
- 5. Be Baptized and receive the Holy Spirit.
- 6. Abide in Christ and his body the Church.
- 7. Go make disciples.



Padre Pio Statue

The Church of the Resurrection will be hosting a life-size statue of Young St. Pio that is making a one-time tour of churches in the region before being installed on Catholic Healthcare International's Casa USA campus in Howell, MI, where he will remain permanently to greet devoted pilgrims & his spiritual children. The one of a kind statue is based on one of the few photos of St. Pio when he was younger. On September 7th, 1910, in the first year of his ministry, Young Padre Pio received the first stigmata while sitting beneath a magnificent tree in Piana Romana, Italy. St. Pio shared the experience in a letter to his spiritual advisor, "In the center of my hands, a red spot appeared, about the size of a coin, and with it, an intense pain in the soles of my feet."

This pain in his hands and feet was the first occurrence of the stigmata, even though they were not visible at the time. It was not until September 20, 1918, that Padre Pio received the visible stigmata after he celebrated morning Mass.

Visiting this statue is to be a part of the history of the pilgrim site coming to Howell, MI where he will be placed under a magnificent tree near the planned Adoration Chapel, a replica of St. Pio's chapel in San Giovanni Rotondo. 
