Grateful to be on Retreat

What a great grace it has been to gather with priests from around the country, including Fr. Mark Rutherford, for this "Holy Desire" retreat at the John Paul II Healing Center. The fraternity has been a great gift and encouragement to me and to the others, and the beautiful truths that are being conveyed and the promise (and experience) of healing has, once again, been a beautiful sign of the love of God for me, for my brother priests, for you, for those you love, for all the world.

The Structure of the Retreat

The format of the days here is such that Dr. Bob Schuchts and Sr. Miriam offer a couple of hours of fundamental teaching about our desires, identity, and call in the mornings, and in the afternoon, we have a more practical prayerful, meditative time with Bart Schuchts, Kim Glass, and Sr. Miriam. The evening is a time of fellowship with the brothers. We've had a fire each night thus far, and we took an evening watching the latest episodes of *The Chosen*, which is a wonderful meditation on the life of Christ and his disciples. What joy it brings to see Jesus and the disciples as so human—laughing—and even poking fun at one another, playfully. I continue to be impressed by how effective this particular portrayal seems of the Lord. May we know the tender yet strong love of Jesus in our daily lives! Last night, as usual, we took some time for laser tag and go-karts. We have a Capuchin friar here whose hood of his habit was caught by the air currents and was quite the spectacle, as well, of course, as Sr. Miriam in her habit. It was a great joy to us all.

Powerful Principles

The retreat is entitled "Holy Desire," and it is a meditation on our heart's desires, and how those desires can become twisted in different ways. When they get twisted, they are "disordered". But one of your desires and mine, even the ones of which you or I might be very ashamed, are fundamentally *good*. Sr. Miriam offered these fundamental truths about our desires and our needs, and what is going on in our hearts when those desires and needs are unmet. I'll plan to talk about these some more after I return.

- Behind every disordered desire is a holy desire.
- Behind every disordered desire is an unmet need.
- Behind every disordered desire is an unhealed wound.
- Behind every disordered desire is a hidden pattern of sin.

As we began the retreat, Sister noted that Satan is a

sniper who targets us deeply to continually hit the wound that is in the place of potential glory and ministry. She summed this point up by saying "Our Gift and Our Wound Stand Side-by-Side." Just imagine! That place in your heart, that pattern of sin, that unhealed wound, that unmet need, all of those reveal a holy desire, that, when you (or I) can let the healing love of God transform and heal, and free us, we will be able to minister in ways that threaten Satan. Let's let the truth about ourselves in and out, that we can be healed, and, in turn, let the love of God come into our hearts, that we would freely receive it, and give that love away. Come, Holy Spirit!

Curiosity and Kindness

We are all very good at holding ourselves or others in judgment and contempt. These responses are our common way of dealing with the shame that we feel about how "wrong" we are, or "bad," or whatever other accusation that Satan has "helped" us believe about ourselves. As we entered into the retreat, Sister invited us to look at our stories (and I will encourage you to look at your stories) with curiosity and kindness, to see that the lies of the evil one that we are so tempted to believe are never the way that God sees us. God sees us—you, me, everyone—as beloved sons or daughters in the Son in whom (including us, in our wholeness) God the Father delights! That's the fundamental truth about ourselves, that, when we dare to let it in, can liberate us to freely receive and give love, which, of course, is the WHOLE POINT of this life we've been privileged to live.

I will be away this weekend, and will return Wednesday, April 21. Please note that there will not be the regular morning confessions Wednesday April 21. I look forward to coming back, renewed in my priesthood and in my sonship in Christ.
