Ending of the Mass Obligation Dispensation

Next week, on the Solemnity of Pentecost, the dispensation from the obligation to attend Sunday Mass will expire. Bishop Boyea has penned some reflections on this, which I invite you to review:

SUNDAY OBLIGATION—SOLEMNITY OF PENTECOST 2021

The first precept of the Church is "You shall attend Mass on Sundays and holy days of obligation and rest from servile labor" (Catechism #2042; see Canon 1247). This is a call for us to sanctify the Lord's Day by worshiping God in the Christian assembly and by resting "from those works and activities which could impede such a sanctification of these days" (Catechism #2042). This is a serious responsibility on the part of all the Faithful People of God "unless excused for a serious reason (for example, illness, the care of infants) or dispensed by their own pastor" (Catechism #2181; see Canon #1245). Obviously, if it is impossible to fulfill this obligation, then it is not binding. When in doubt, speak with your pastor. It seems to me that a large majority of parishioners have made their return to regular Mass attendance, and I want to encourage everyone to do so on a regular basis, as one is able. As Bishop Boyea says here, this is in keeping with the expectation that we gather together weekly to worship the Lord. Some of you remain guite concerned about the virus. If that's the case for you, I am happy to continue to extend such a dispensation to you (let me know). If anyone is sick or caring for the sick, of course, he or she doesn't need to let me know. The Lord sees the heart of those who are serving in that way, and there is no obligation. Even when that is the case, however, it is important to set apart time on Sundays for prayer and rest in the Lord.

Plans for Return

As we anticipate this return, I think it prudent to encourage people to wear masks, though, as I have said repeatedly, we will not require mask-wearing. Please note that I will continue the current Mass schedule through the end of (at least) July. **NB:** *Beginning on the* Solemnity of Pentecost, we will reserve the outermost bank of pews for "every-other pew" seating, for those who are still concerned about being too close to others. I know this will cause some challenges for those who are used to sitting in those pews. If you are used to sitting in those pews, but would be willing to make space for others who want to be more assured of "distance," please consider making a change out of love and concern for them. We will open up the choir loft at the 9:30 Mass for "overflow." Unfortunately, that's not possible during the 8:00 or 11:30 a.m. Masses.

Resurrection School Super Raffle and Class Project Auction

Ascension of the Lord

Jesus is Risen from the dead! For forty days, he appeared to the believers and encouraged them in their belief. He desires to encourage us in our belief as well. The testimony of the Risen One is as relevant to our world today as it was in the first century. In our first reading, from the beginning of the Acts of the Apostles, we read the following, which was penned by St. Luke, who also wrote the Gospel of Luke:

In the first book, Theophilus, I dealt with all that Jesus did and taught until the day he was taken up, after giving instructions through the Holy Spirit to the apostles whom he had chosen. He presented himself alive to them by many proofs after he had suffered, appearing to them during forty days and speaking about the kingdom of God. While meeting with them, he enjoined them not to depart from Jerusalem, but to wait for "the promise of the Father about which you have heard me speak; for John baptized with water, but in a few days you will be baptized with the Holy Spirit."

Next weekend, we will recall the great gift of being baptized with the Holy Spirit at Pentecost.

Come, Holy Spirit!

As we anticipate the Solemnity of Pentecost, may we clear out the clogging effects of sin and unbelief in our hearts, and look forward with eager anticipation for the grace of the Lord to come upon us and those we love next Sunday.
