Celebrating Graduating Seniors

Congratulations to all the high school graduates from the Church of the Resurrection! Today at the 9:30 a.m. Mass, we will honor graduating high school seniors. May God bless them as they complete this chapter and anticipate the next chapter in their lives of learning and living as witnesses of Christ's love and truth in the world.

Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ (Corpus Christi)

Today, we celebrate this great Solemnity, which announces to the world our devotion to Jesus, truly present in the Blessed Sacrament, Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity. Our liturgies owe a tremendous amount to St. Thomas Aquinas, a Dominican priest and Doctor of the Church. He was brilliant and prayerful, and he handed onto us the fruits of his contemplation, in true Dominican fashion. St. Thomas had a mystical experience while celebrating mass on December 6, 1273, a few months before his death, after which he stopped writing the Summa. Despite the genius and wisdom of his writing, after the glimpse he was given of the beauty and glory in a vision, he said "I cannot go on . . . All that I have written seems to me like so much straw compared to what I have seen and what has been revealed to me." On another occasion, Jesus spoke to him from the crucifix, saying, "You have written well of me, Thomas! What do you desire?" To which, Thomas replied, "Non nisi te, Domine." Only you, Lord (Jesus). May our hearts and minds be like unto St. Thomas Aguinas, that after an offer from the Lord of anything, we would wisely choose "nothing but Jesus." For, having Him, we have ALL.

Speaking of Dominicans, we have been blessed again this year by the presence of four Dominican Sisters of Mary, Mother of the Eucharist. Their service at Resurrection School and Lansing Catholic, and their presence in our parish community, has been a great gift to us and to the children who attend our schools.

In addition to Dick Schaefer, the other members of the PPC are as follows: Bill Richardson, Judy Edwards, Jason Mendiola, Marcus Wells, Barbara Dion, and Marianne Vasievich. I am going to be asking one of the Finance Council members to join the PPC at our meeting in the next few weeks, so there will be an additional member of the PPC at that point. The parish Leadership Team members also meet with the PPC, which allows them to hear the perspective of the PPC members, as well, instead of just having me be the conduit of their observations. The parish Leadership Team includes myself, Chris Spalding, Jacob Allstott, and Sara DeWitt. Liz O'Neill will be returning to her position at the parish in August after she taught British Literature last year at Lansing Catholic teaching. She will rejoin the Leadership Team. Please keep the PPC and Leadership Team in your prayers, that we would be wise as we discern the Lord's leading for us, and strive to help you all bear rich fruit that will remain. Thanks!
