

Keeping Our Children Safe

For nearly twenty years, Catholics in the US have been committed and intentional about creating codes of conduct and helping everyone in the community be mindful of "red flags" about potential grooming and/or abuse. I'm grateful that we are able to gather together again in person and to have our children spend time together on the playground. As we enjoy these gifts, let's also be prudent and attentive to the potential risks of those who may try to take advantage of trust and/or laxity in our oversight of children. As you surely know, abuse is most often committed by people children know. Let's recommit to protecting all God's children. And please pray for all those who have suffered (in the Church or without) from abuse of any kind. Lord, have mercy!

The Beauty of the Heavenly Liturgy

When we come to Mass, we are invited into a tremendous mystery, a holy and awe-inspiring entry into the heavenly realms. In the Sacred Liturgy, the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass, heaven, as it were, comes to earth. The more our celebration of the Mass can be beautiful, reverent, and mysterious, the more we (and our children) will sense that the Mass is anything but "ordinary." For these reasons, for years we have been striving to foster a spirit of reverence and beauty. As I've mentioned in recent weeks, I am trying to help us all have a stance of prayerfulness prior to the start of Mass and afterward, for us to realize that we are in the Presence of God, and it is best to chat and catch up outside of Mass (in Mercy Hall) or in the vestibule.

Stance of Prayerfulness After Mass

After Mass, as I've mentioned in recent weeks, let us try to refrain from "catching up" in the church and wait until we are outside the church or at least in the vestibule. I love the fact that we like (even love!) each other, and desire to have fellowship with each other. And that is Good! Let's try to both honor our desire to engage with each other and also allow those who want to prepare for Mass (or give Thanksgiving after Mass) the time and space and silence to do so. If there were a more sizeable "gathering space," it would be easier for us to sustain a holy sense of reverence at all times in our church which one often finds in great and glorious basilicas, but let's strive to do so more and more. I think we all recognize at some level that silence is both poignant and pregnant with anticipation. Silence conveys our stance of anticipation and fosters the most powerful attitude we can bring to the Mass: receptivity. Just as silence prepares our hearts, other senses are drawn in too.

The visual beauty of the space is vital for a true anticipation of the Heavenly Liturgy. Incense involves the sense of smell. Beautiful music draws our hearts up into worship of God. Clear and compelling preaching of the Word is also vital to help us grow deeper into the Mysteries we celebrate. Consider, in this context, the vision of heaven John describes in the Book of Revelation:

Then I saw standing in the midst of the throne and the four living creatures and the elders, a Lamb that seemed to have been slain He came and received the scroll from the right hand of the one who sat on the throne. When he took it, the four living creatures and the twenty-four elders fell down before the Lamb. Each of the elders held a harp and gold bowls filled with incense, which are the prayers of the holy ones. They sang a new hymn: "Worthy are you to receive the scroll and to break open its seals, for you were slain and with your blood you purchased for God those from every tribe and tongue, people and nation. You made them a kingdom and priests for our God, and they will reign on earth."

I looked again and heard the voices of many angels who surrounded the throne and the living creatures and the elders. They were countless in number, and they cried out in a loud voice: "Worthy is the Lamb that was slain to receive power and riches, wisdom and strength, honor and glory and blessing." Then I heard every creature in heaven and on earth and under the earth and in the sea, everything in the universe, cry out: "To the one who sits on the throne and to the Lamb be blessing and honor, glory and might, forever and ever." The four living creatures answered, "Amen," and the elders fell down and worshiped. (Revelation 5:6-14)

My desire is to help all of us enter more completely into the band mystery of the Heavenly Liturgy, to which we are all invited by the Lamb who was slain. As part of this sense of the Holy, our introduction of the use of the Paten will help us pause and reflect on Whom (not *what*) we receive when we receive Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament. As St. Augustine said of the Eucharist: "Receive what you are (the Body of Christ); become what you receive." That's the invitation. That's the Glory of our life in Christ.




Enrollment at LCHS
