Into Your Hands, Father: Abandoning Ourselves to the God Who Loves Us

On Sunday, I quoted at length from a book I recently started reading, and which I heartily recommend to you. As the title reveals, it focuses on entrusting (abandoning) ourselves to the loving care of God. The excerpt I read from the powerful book by Fr. Wilfrid Stinissen, OCD, began with the following provocative quote:

How can you know that you are living in God's will? This is the sign: If you are troubled about anything, that means you are not completely abandoned to God's will. The one who lives according to God's will is not troubled about anything. If he needs something, he surrenders it and even himself to the Lord. He places it in his hands. If he does not get what he needs, he remains calm, as though he had received it. He is not afraid, whatever happens, for he knows that it is God's will. When he is afflicted with illness, he thinks: I need this sickness, otherwise God would not have sent it. He thus preserves peace in body and soul. This text by the Russian Starets Silvan (1866—1938), whose holiness is widely recognized in the Orthodox Church, can be used as a test. Does it make us happy or angry when we read it? If we feel angry, it is perhaps because we do not see things that happen in the right context, namely, as material in God's hands, which he uses to carry out his plans. It is irrelevant to God whether the material is good or bad in itself. It is enough that he touches it for it to become a suitable tool (p. 21).

. . . . St. Thérèse of the Child Jesus tells how she enjoyed walking [with her eyes closed], holding her father's hand and experiencing the security that lies in complete confidence in someone who is absolutely trustworthy. When seen in this way, an ordinary walk becomes an exciting adventure.

If we do not dare to walk hand in hand with God, whose hand shall we choose? Can God lead us astray? Can we trust more in our own limited vision than in him who has an overview of the whole journey? Is it not ridiculous to think that certain things could be lacking to us or that someone or something could put obstacles in our way? God knows exactly what we need. Everything he gives is carefully measured to our needs. He is the only one who knows our true needs.

When we complain, we usually do it because of our <u>imaginary</u> needs.

The one who willingly lets himself be led by God walks on a very straight path. He saves an infinite amount of time and trouble. Most Christians invest a great deal of their energy in resisting God. As soon as we stop struggling, an unbelievable amount of energy is released. We suddenly move at a much quicker pace and are much happier.

Resistance to life and its circumstances creates an inner cramp, which is the main and most significant reason for people's unhappiness. If this cramp disappears, everything becomes much easier. Then there is no longer any possibility of frustration. Frustration comes when we do not get what we think we need, when what we expect does not happen. Those who trust that God is guiding everything can never be frustrated. If they do not get a certain thing, they know they do not need it. If something they have waited for does not happen, they conclude that it is not meant for them. They are not disappointed, because everything is just as it should be; not in itself; far from it, but as the environment they are to live in, a "divine environment" (pp. 34-35).

Interested in learning more about the Catholic Church? Each fall, as we begin a new season of learning, we also

begin programming for those who are interested in learning more about the Catholic faith. This year, Rich Budd will be teaching classes for adults as well as high school students who are interested in learning more and potentially becoming Catholics at the Easter Vigil in the spring. Rich's full time job is Director of Family Life for the Diocese of Lansing. He helped out with the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA) classes last year, and I'm grateful that he will be serving the parish in this way. RCIA will be held on Monday evenings, beginning October 4th. Once again this year, Susan Bartold will be working with those students up to 8th grade who are interested in learning more about and/ or becoming Catholic at the Easter Vigil in the spring. 


