#### **Formation Courses Return!**

Beginning this Thursday at 7:00 p.m. in Mercy Hall, we will hold our next formation course. The course is titled, **"Spiritual Growth through Study."** The course explores the ways in which good spiritual reading can enhance our life of faith, draw us closer to God and inspire us to greater love of neighbor. It provides a rationale for why reading spiritual works should be a regular part of our growth in the Christian life and why it is indispensable that we feed our minds with the things of God. It also provides practical guidelines for what to read and how to read it and recommends an approach that is aimed at spiritual growth and not merely a cerebral exercise. The dates of the course are **Oct 21, 28 and Nov 4.** 

Dr. John Yocum will give the talks. John has a Doctorate in Theology from the University of Oxford. He has taught Theology at Oxford, at Loyola School of Theology in Manila and currently teaches at the Sacred Heart Catholic Seminary in Detroit, Michigan. We would love to have you join us. #### **School Auction and Super Raffle**

#### Update on Witness to Hope (Sanctuary Renovation)

We are still waiting for quotes about the costs of alternative construction techniques for the renovation of our sanctuary. As I have mentioned in the past, our original vision for the sanctuary was a less-elaborate (and, I believe, less beautiful) one. Based on numbers that Tom gave me, it looks like the total cost of the project as it currently stands may be as high as \$1.25 million. I am hopeful that we will be able to get this information and be able to meet with the Finance Council and renovation committee to discuss the various options, hopefully within the month. If you would, please keep us and this project in your prayers. In closing, I want to thank all who have given so faithfully to the Witness to Hope Campaign. Your generosity is a great gift to the parish. Thank you!

#### What Is the Lord Saying to You and Me?

Last weekend, I preached about the words that Jesus spoke to rich man. We read: Jesus, looking at him, loved him and said to him, "You are lacking in one thing. Go, sell what you have, and give to the poor and you will have treasure in heaven; then come, follow me."

The Lord looks at each of us, lovingly, and speaks to us about what He is asking us to give up in order to be more our true selves. At the Sunday Masses, I quoted (yet again) from the conclusion of C.S. Lewis's great introduction to Christianity, Mere Christianity. I encourage you to read the entire book. Here are the last few paragraphs of the book, which are more than I quoted, but provide a good context for the call to move "beyond ourselves." But there must be a real giving up of the self. You must throw it away 'blindly' so to speak. Christ will indeed give you a real personality: but you must not go to Him for the sake of that. As long as your own personality is what you are bothering about you are not going to Him at all. The very first step is to try to forget about the self altogether. Your real, new self (which is Christ's and also yours, and yours just because it is His) will not come as long as you are looking for it. It will come when you are looking for *Him. Does that sound strange? The same principle holds,* you know, for more everyday matters. Even in social life, you will never make a good impression on other people until you stop thinking about what sort of impression you are making. Even in literature and art, no man who bothers about originality will ever be original: whereas if you simply try to tell the truth (without caring twopence how often it has been told before) you will, nine times out of ten, become original without ever having noticed it. The principle runs through all life from top to bottom. Give up yourself, and you will find your real self. Lose your life and you will save it. Submit to death, death of your ambitions and favourite wishes every day and death of your whole body in the end: submit with every fibre of your being, and you will find eternal life. Keep back nothing. *Nothing that you have not given away will be really yours.* Nothing in you that has not died will ever be raised from the dead. Look for yourself, and you will find in the long run only hatred, loneliness, despair, rage, ruin, and decay. But look for Christ and you will find Him, and with Him everything else thrown in. #### **Becoming the Servant of All**

This same idea is made very clear this week in the Gospel. To become great is to become the servant of others. The Lord is exalted to the highest place, and He invites us to emulate Him. This Gospel highlights once again the paradoxical nature of our faith. Jesus invites us again to emulate Him. May we respond to His grace and live together as witnesses of the Lord's love.
