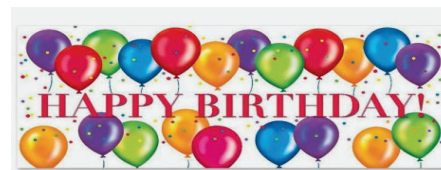

Solemnity of All Saints

Tomorrow, November 1, with all the Church, we celebrate the Solemnity of All Saints. It is not a Holy Day of Obligation, but we will offer two Masses, one at 8:15 a.m. (School Mass) and the other at 12:00 Noon. We remember them and call upon them as we pray the Mass. May we be “caught up” in the hope we have as we celebrate our brothers and sisters who have “made it home” to heaven.

Commemoration of All the Faithful Departed (All Souls)

November 2 is All Souls Day, when we pray for all our beloved dead, that they will be purified of any attachments to the things of earth. We fail in our charity if we neglect to pray for those who have died. One wise priest, when asked when we should stop praying for our deceased loved ones, said (as if it were obvious), “When they’re canonized.” Until then, let’s not stop praying for them. We will offer three Masses that day, one at 8:15 a.m. (School Mass) and one at 12:00 noon, and an Extraordinary Form at 6:30 p.m. (Also, please see the note below about our Mass at 11:00 a.m. on November 6th).

Requiem Mass at 6:30 p.m. Tuesday, November 2

Fr. Joe Campbell, Chaplain at Lansing Catholic High School will pray, with Bishop Boyea’s express permission, a Requiem Mass as our third Mass on All Souls’ Day. It will be what is called a “Missa Cantata” Requiem Mass of the *usus antiquior*, according to the 1962 Roman Missal. This Mass is often called the “Extraordinary Form” or “Traditional Latin Mass.” Our schola will sing the proper chants for the Mass. Worship aids will be available for those who attend the Mass. I am grateful to Fr. Joe, the servers, and the musicians for their extra efforts to offer this beautiful way to pray for our loved ones who have passed. May they all rest in peace! (I will hear confessions during Mass, and will assist with the distribution of communion at the time for communion.)

Why Purgatory? It’s a Place of Promise and Grace

If we’re honest, we can admit that most of us are not yet perfect (which Jesus tells us is a pre-requisite to see God), and are likely not going to be perfect by the time—however near or distant that is—when the Lord calls us home. For us, the imperfect, Purgatory is a great grace. Though it is often confused as a place of “second chance” for those who did not know God or live in grace in their earthly life, it is instead a condition in which believers are purified of any imperfections and stubborn “attachments” to things less than God. Through the purifying fire of God’s love, aided by our prayers and acts of reparation, those in purgatory are perfected and will, in God’s perfect timing, enter the joy of heaven. Here is how the *Catechism of the Catholic Church* explains it:

III. THE FINAL PURIFICATION, OR PURGATORY

1030 *All who die in God's grace and friendship, but still imperfectly purified, are indeed assured of their eternal salvation; but after death they undergo purification, so as to achieve the holiness necessary to enter the joy of heaven.*

1031 *The Church gives the name Purgatory to this final purification of the elect, which is entirely different from the*

*punishment of the damned.*⁶⁰⁴ *The Church formulated her doctrine of faith on Purgatory especially at the Councils of Florence and Trent. The tradition of the Church, by reference to certain texts of Scripture, speaks of a cleansing fire.*⁶⁰⁵

As for certain lesser faults, we must believe that, before the Final Judgment, there is a purifying fire. He who is truth says that whoever utters blasphemy against the Holy Spirit will be pardoned

*neither in this age nor in the age to come. From this sentence we understand that certain offenses can be forgiven in this age, but certain others in the age to come.*⁶⁰⁶

Plan to join us for the Auction on November 13, as well. It is a great evening of fellowship and fundraising for our school.

Praying for the Dead

November is a month when we remember our loved ones who have died. There is a book near the statue of Mary (and the baptismal font) for you to list family members whom you wish to remember in prayer this month. We will also be offering Masses, as stated above, for our loved ones on November 2, All Souls’ Day. *Please note that I will offer also offer Mass at 11:00 a.m., November 6, for all parishioners who have died between November 2, 2020 and November 1, 2021.* If you have a loved one who has died this past year, please let Meredith know, and we will include your loved one in the Eucharistic Prayer as we pray for the dead by name. Feel free, of course, to invite families to join us for this Mass. Every time we pray for the dead, we perform one of the spiritual works of mercy. May they rest in peace!

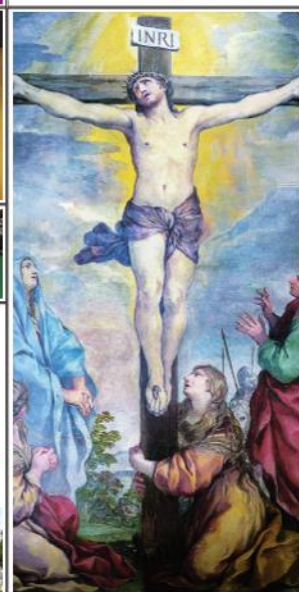
