#### **Technology & Social Media**

Last weekend at the Sunday Masses that I preached, I spoke (again!) about the dangers and risks of technology, and most especially social media. I will be addressing issues in more depth on my blog in coming days. Some people heard my exhortation as a total denunciation of the internet, but for the record, I don't believe we are able to pull back entirely from the internet for our "modern life." As you have no doubt sensed, along with many technology commentators, I have serious concerns about the consequences of living in our increasingly digital world. It seems to me that the convenience of the internet and the nearly infinite ways we can spend time online are affecting our hearts and minds in ways we can't yet fully appreciate. The dangers are especially great for our children and young men and women who are, as they say, "digital natives." I hope that my homily encouraged you and your family and friends to talk about ways to "pull back" from technology use, both from the standpoint of security and the addictive nature of smart phones. Speaking in general, I can't help but believe that "less is more" when it comes to technology. My hope is that we would all prayerfully evaluate our own technological use. As we proceed, let's keep each other in prayer, most especially our young brothers and sisters.

#### Praying for the Dead

November is a month when we remember our loved ones who have died. There is a book near the statue of Mary (and the baptismal font) for you to list family members whom you wish to remember in prayer this month.

#### **Plenary Indulgence**

There was a recent change in the extension of a plenary indulgence that had been reserved for November 1-8 to all of November. Here's language from a recent article from Catholic News Agency:

The specific Nov. 2 plenary indulgence one can obtain for the souls in Purgatory by visiting a church or an oratory and reciting an Our Father and the Creed, can now also be done on any day in November.

#### What is a plenary indulgence?

A plenary indulgence is a grace granted by the Catholic Church through the merits of Jesus Christ, Mary, and all the saints to remove the temporal punishment due to sin. The indulgence cleanses a person of all temporal punishment due to sin. However, it must always be accompanied by a full detachment from sin.

Conditions to receive a plenary indulgence in all cases: Detachment from all sin, even venial.

Sacramental confession, Holy Communion and prayer for the intentions of the pope. Sacramental confession and receiving the Eucharist can happen up to about 20 days before or after the act performed to receive a plenary indulgence.

It is appropriate that Communion and the prayer take place on the same day that the work is completed. One sacramental confession is sufficient for several plenary indulgences. However for each plenary indulgence one wishes to receive, a separate reception of the Eucharist and a separate prayer for the intentions of the Holy Father are required. The Vatican decree issued due to the pandemic allows Catholics who are unable to leave their home, such as the sick or elderly, to still obtain a plenary indulgence by reciting prayers for the dead before an image of Jesus or the Blessed Mother. Examples of prayers homebound Catholics can pray include the rosary, the Chaplet of Divine Mercy, lauds or vespers of the Office for the Dead, or by performing a work of mercy by offering their pain to God.
