

### Merry Christmas!

May you and those you love experience the joy and peace of this holy season, and know the love of God made flesh in the person of the Baby Jesus. When you come to Mass on Christmas and throughout the Octave of Christmas, we will have copies of Fr. Wilfrid Stinissen's Into Your Hands, Father: Abandoning Ourselves To The God Who Loves Us. We will also have an array of books we've given out in past years, for those who haven't had a chance to pick one of those up in years past. We also invite you to pick up a copy of the most recent Resurrection Magazine, which we trust will be ready for the Christmas Masses. If you would, please pray for all who will attend Mass here at Christmas, that all of us will grow in wisdom, knowledge and virtue in the New Year. We will also have pamphlets for those who would like to read through the Catechism of the Catholic Church and the Bible in a year.

### Special Event: Twelfth Night

Next month, we have planned a parish cultural event, which we hope to have on an annual basis, called the Twelfth Night Celebration. The event will take place from 6:30 p.m. on January 8 and is a celebration of the great gift of Christ's manifestation at Christmas and Epiphany. It will be set on a Saturday closest to the twelfth day/night of the Christmas season during Epiphanytide. Mercy Hall will be decked out as something resembling a pub(!). Adults in the parish and friends are invited to join us for an evening of songs, music, and poetry that will inspire and entertain in equal measure. The Twelfth Night has been a traditional celebration since before medieval times, particularly in Europe, and involves the consumption of abundant food and drink as well as performances to honor the birth of our Savior. You can sign-up to join us on our website. Space is limited, so register early. (We look forward to having other cultural events throughout the year, some of which will be open to the whole family, but again, this one is for adults.) I hope to see you there!

### Christmas & New Year's Mass Schedule

This coming week, we celebrate our Church's second highest feast, the Nativity of our Lord Jesus Christ. Even if they don't typically come to Mass, your friends and family will probably feel the urge to come to church. Invite them to join you as we gather together to rejoice in Our Newborn King. On Christmas Eve, we will have our typical 8:15 a.m. Mass. There will be Masses at 4:30 and Midnight (prelude music will commence at 11:30 p.m.). On Christmas Day, there will be two Christmas Day Masses, 9:30 and 11:30 a.m. (NB: There will be no 5:00 p.m. Saturday anticipatory Mass on Christmas, but we will have three Masses on Sunday, December 26 (Solemnity of the Holy Family), as usual: 8:00 a.m., 9:30 a.m., and 11:30 a.m. January 1 is a Holy Day of Obligation, the Octave of Christmas and the Solemnity of the Blessed Virgin Mary, Mother of God. We will have two Vigil Masses on December 31st, one at 4:30 p.m. and another at 10:30 p.m., which will be followed by adoration with Benediction just prior to Midnight. On January 1<sup>st</sup>, New Year's Day, we will have one Mass at 10:30 a.m. (NB: There will be no 5:00 p.m. Mass on Saturday, January 1, but we will have three Masses on January 2, which is the Epiphany of the Lord, as usual: 8:00 a.m., 9:30 a.m., and 11:30 a.m.)
