#### The Baptism of the Lord

This weekend, the Church recalls a third theophany or manifestation of God. The first theophany, of course, was the Nativity. The second was the *Epipha*ny, which we celebrated last week. This is the third, when Jesus was baptized. Here is the account from St. Luke: The people were filled with expectation, and all were asking in their hearts whether John might be the Christ. John answered them all, saying, "I am baptizing you with water, but one mightier than I is coming. I am not worthy to loosen the thongs of his sandals. He will baptize you with the Holy Spirit and fire." After all the people had been baptized and Jesus also had been baptized and was praying, heaven was opened and the Holy Spirit descended upon him in bodily form like a dove. And a voice came from heaven, "You are my beloved Son; with you I am well pleased." God the Father spoke from heaven, along with the Spirit descending upon Him, like a

dove.

Through our own baptism, we are brought into this same mystery of the Godhead. We are plunged into the death and resurrection of Christ through our baptism. In Christ, we are invited to hear the Father say, "You are my beloved son (daughter); with you I am well pleased." It may be difficult for us to believe that we please the Father, but our life is now in Christ. Indeed, we the baptized have received the Holy Spirit, and we too have been anointed "priest, prophet, and king," just as Jesus was. We are Christians, which translates "anointed ones."

#### **Being Lights in Dark Times**

Last weekend in my homily I spoke about the importance of us living up to our dignity as members of the Body of Christ. Through our baptism, we have the Power of God dwelling in us, and this great gift entails a tremendous responsibility as well. We are called to be Christ(ians) in our homes, schools, workplaces, and communities, and are empowered by God to live lives of witness to the Light and Truth that we find in Jesus. We are the bearers of the Good News, of the Gospel, and are empowered with the Holy Spirit to preach the Good News in our lives and through our words. Let us never forget the great gift we received in our baptism, and look to God's super-abundant grace in all our times of need. He will provide us timely help as we turn to Him. With fresh awareness of and gratitude for our baptism, let's seek ways to "Go and Announce the Gospel of the Lord" today.

### **Realigning Resources for Mission Parish Groupings**

Many of you get *Faith Magazine*, which this month featured an article about "parish groupings" by Bishop Boyea. Here are two of the paragraphs from that article:

In consultation with the Priest Assignment Board and Mrs. Deb Amato, who will lead our implementation, we discerned eight groupings to invite to be early adopters. I then called the potential moderator (like a lead pastor) of each grouping to see if he would be willing to lead the other priest(s) in the grouping. The moderators' first task will be to gather their brother priests together in prayer and discernment to develop a covenant. This will guide their becoming a Communion of Priests who are together on mission. This agreement will also determine who will lead the parishes in the grouping to fulfill the mission together. Each parish will retain its identity, but ever more integration and collaboration will be the means for us to achieve Christ's Mission to us.

So I made the calls to my brother priests to determine their willingness to be moderators. Once their agreement had been given, I contacted the other priests in each grouping to ask if they would be willing to pray and minister in solidum (the canonical term found in Canon 517.1 which means together or as a whole). We might see this as a form of solidarity in ministry. It will be the duty of these priests to engage the deacons and lay ministers in their parishes.

#### **Our Parish Grouping**

The "North Lansing" parish grouping, of which we will be part, will be comprised of St. Mary Cathedral, St. Andrew Dung-Lac, St. Therese, St. Jude, and Resurrection, with Father Karl Pung as Moderator. As you might well expect, much remains to be prayerfully discerned concerning how we (and other parish groupings) will work collaboratively together to better fulfill the Mission of Jesus Christ. Guided by the Holy Spirit, I am confident that this group of current pastors will prayerfully discern, along with our respective staff members and other lay leadership, how to both honor the cultures of the particular parishes that are part of the grouping all the while seeking ways to be more effective and better stewards of our collective ministry. Please pray for the priests and the other parishes in our grouping, as we begin the initial stages of planning for this change. We want this process to be helpful for the mission and to be received well by members of our parishes who are open to and committed to helping us fulfill the Lord's call to spread the Gospel in word and deed. Let's keep praying, "Come, Holy Spirit!"
