God Gives Gifts!

Last week, I preached about the gifts of the Holy Spirit, and mentioned that the Lord gives all the baptized gifts, which the Lord longs for us to "joyfully use . . . "for the building up the Kingdom of God and the salvation of souls," as we've been praying for years. In that light, I offer you these very encouraging words of Blessed John Henry Newman, which highlight the importance of each and every one of us. It's my desire that we would all know the power of his words:

We are all created to [God's] glory—we are created to do His will. I am created to do something or to be something for which no one else is created; I have a place in God's counsels, in God's world, which no one else has; whether I be rich or poor, despised or esteemed by man, God knows me and calls me by my name. God has created me to do Him some definite service; He has committed some work to me which He has not committed to another. I have my mission Somehow I am necessary for His purposes, as necessary in my place as an Archangel in his I have a part in this great work; I am a link in a chain, a bond of connexion between persons. He has not created me for naught. I shall do good, I shall do His work; I shall be an angel of peace, a preacher of truth in my own place . . . if I do but keep His commandments and serve Him in my calling. (Blessed John Henry Newman)

100th Anniversary Directory

As I mentioned last weekend, we are planning an anniversary pictorial directory. December 25, 2022 will be the 100th anniversary of the first Mass that was celebrated in the "Annex," which is the lower level of the current elementary building, where the Little Shamrocks Preschool is housed currently. We will have multiple events celebrating the anniversary, beginning in June, and we look forward to having our directory together for this important celebration. Please sign up after Masses this weekend and next. On Saturdays, we will have sign-ups in the vestibule, and on Sundays, you can sign up in the hall. Thanks in advance! I'm grateful to tell you that all those who have their picture taken will get a free directory, and a free 8" x 10" photo. You will have the opportunity (without a sales pitch) to purchase more, should you so desire. (We will make accommodations for those who are out of state for the winter.)

11:30 a.m. Mass Liturgy Changes

First of all, given that most of those who attend the 11:30 a.m. Mass typically sit in the two center sections, and receive communion from me, I am typically distributing communion longer than either of the other two regularly scheduled Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion (EMHCs). The Church has granted a special "indult" to allow those who are not priests to distribute communion, largely out of a practical concern about the time to distribute communion. Given that most of those who attend the 11:30 a.m. Mass desire to receive communion from the priest (which is their right, of course), it makes sense for us to reduce the number of regularly scheduled EMHCs at the 11:30 from two to one. He or she will distribute to the eastmost sets of pews and then distribute to the westmost sets of pews after they finish on the east side. This change will not change the total time of the Mass, given that the EMHCs always finish before me at that Mass.

Credo & Pater Noster

A few weeks ago, I celebrated the 11:30 a.m. Mass in Latin, which I will do each second Sunday of the month moving forward. As I mentioned at the 11:30 a.m. Mass last weekend, even though that Mass will be the *Novus Ordo* in Latin, I will pray the proper prayers and preface in English, though the dialogue parts will be in Latin. To become more familiar with the Latin Creed (*Credo*) and Our Father (*Pater Noster*), we will sing that at all the 11:30 a.m. Masses moving forward, not just the second Sunday of the month Latin Mass. The other Masses will not have any change. The music for the chanted version of the *Credo* can be found at number 213 of the St. Michael Hymnal. The *Pater Noster* can be found on page 86 of the St. Michael Hymnal.

Our Parish Grouping

The "North Lansing" parish grouping, of which we will be part, will be comprised of St. Mary Cathedral, St. Andrew Dung-Lac, St. Therese, St. Jude, and Resurrection, with Father Karl Pung as Moderator. As you might well expect, much remains to be prayerfully discerned concerning how we (and other parish groupings) will work collaboratively together to better fulfill the Mission of Jesus Christ. Guided by the Holy Spirit, I am confident that this group of current pastors will prayerfully discern, along with our respective staff members and other lay leadership, how to both honor the cultures of the particular parishes that are part of the grouping all the while seeking ways to be more effective and better stewards of our collective ministry. Please pray for the priests and the other parishes in our grouping, as we begin the initial stages of planning for this change. The pastors of the various parishes will begin meeting together this next week. We want this process to be helpful for the mission and to be received well by members of our parishes who are open to and committed to helping us fulfill the Lord's call to spread the Gospel in word and deed. Let's keep praying, "Come, Holy Spirit!"
