Because this is Catholic Schools Week, we will be add morning Masses on Monday and Tuesday at 8:15 a.m., as well as our typical Masses on Wednesday through Friday at 8:15 a.m. Feel free to join us for any or all of these Masses this week.

"The Last Gospel"

Some parishioners will remember that the Mass prior to Vatican II use to conclude with the reading of John 1:1-14, which, because it was proclaimed after the conclusion of Mass, was called "The Last Gospel." A year ago, I wrote an entry on my (very) occasional blog, "Come What May" where I talked about the Gospel for the 7th Day within the Octave of Christmas, which is John 1:1-18. That text comes from what is called the "prologue" of the Gospel of John. Here is an excerpt from my blog post from a year ago:

As I proclaimed it this morning, I couldn't help but be struck—yet again—by the power of John's beautiful prologue. So much Good News is captured so poetically in the first chapter of his gospel. Here is an apt excerpt:

But to those who did accept him
he gave power to become children of God,
to those who believe in his name,
who were born not by natural generation
nor by human choice nor by a man's decision
but of God.
And the Word became flesh
and made his dwelling among us,
and we saw his glory,
the glory as of the Father's only-begotten Son,
full of grace and truth.

Thanks be to God, the Word did, in fact, become flesh. And dwelt among us. And he gave us the power to become children of God.

After proclaiming this (last) Gospel of the year, I expressed my hope (perhaps prophetically, perhaps in false hope) that—should the Lord tarry—the Novus Ordo might one day be modified to reinstate the traditional reading of "The Last Gospel" at the conclusion of Mass after the final blessing. Much was lost, it seems to me, with this change. And I say that as one who does not celebrate the Traditional Latin Mass. Some parishioners have asked me to celebrate the Extraordinary Form, and I'm not opposed. In fact, I hope to be able to learn to do so. For now, though, I strive to celebrate the Novus Ordo Mass as beautifully and reverently as possible. As I have done so, I have been inspired by Pope Benedict XVI's vision of a "mutual enrichment" of the two forms of the Mass.

The Last Gospel reminds us why Jesus came. Today it offered a fitting finish to the year. Who knows? Perhaps one day it will do the same for every Mass.

The Darkness Has Not Overcome [the Light]

Given all the suffering that we have experienced and witnessed these past few years, I have taken great comfort in the entire prologue, which begins as follows, especially the powerful truth in the underlined verse:

In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. He was in the beginning with God. All things came to be through him, and without him nothing came to be. What came to be through him was life, and this life was the light of the human race; the light shines in the darkness, and the darkness has not overcome it.

It's very familiar to us, of course, but we do well to recall and celebrate the truth that God came among us as the light. The mystery is profound, and we're caught up into it. Through our own baptism, God has enlightened us, and made us bearers of the Light of Christ. *The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness has not overcome it.* And that will continue to be true, come what may; come whatever may!

Reminding Ourselves after Every Mass

Because of the particular confusions of our time and the importance of the light in dark times, I believe it is time for us to return to an old practice. After prayerful discernment and consultation, I have decided that beginning this weekend, I will proclaim John 1:1-14 after the Marian Antiphon (or another suitable hymn) after the conclusion of the Mass. The faithful then will be invited to pray the St. Michael Prayer after that. This will change only slightly our practice at the end of Mass. I am convinced that this change will help us be strengthened by the truths conveyed in John 1.

The order of events at the conclusion of Mass will be as follows:

- 1. Final Blessing
- 2. Marian Antiphon or other appropriate hymn, and recessional.
- 3. The celebrant will then come forward to read the "Last Gospel." We will, as the old custom had it, genuflect prior to the verse which says, "and the word became flesh..."
- 4. After that, the faithful will be invited to recite the St. Michael Prayer with the priest.

This change ensures that we are proclaiming the Last Gospel and praying the St. Michael Prayer after the conclusion of the Mass, final blessing, and recessional. I hope and pray that this will be an aid and encouragement to you. I trust that it will be.
