What a Catholic Schools Week!

The Lord poured on the snow and this past week, and we look forward to rescheduling some of the events that we had scheduled for CSW. On Tuesday, at the afternoon staff vs. 8th grade beachball volleyball game, we prayed for a snow day. And God answered our prayers (okay, we had reasons to suspect that we'd get some snow!). At this point (Wednesday), it's uncertain whether we'll have another snow day on Thursday, though that looks rather likely. It seems that every Catholic Schools Week, we have snow days. I'm glad for the kids, their families, along with our staff and their families, that we get these days to enjoy the glories and beauty of a good snowfall.

Synod for a Synodal Church

This weekend, I will be playing an audio version of Bishop Boyea's homily that invites us into the process of the "Synod for a Synodal Church." In coming months, we will have opportunities to engage with a variety of issues as members of the Church of Lansing. We hope to have materials to hand out this weekend, that you are invited to respond to over the next few months.

Greetings in the Lord,

As you may have heard, Pope Francis has called for a worldwide synod, asking us to listen as the entire People of God, to what the Holy Spirit is saying to the Church. He is asking us to examine how we are journeying with not only the faithful in the pews but those fallen away from the Church and those on the peripheries of society.

*In the Diocese of Lansing we are rooting our synodal process in the mission we have already undertaken in recent years, particularly based on Bishop Boyea's Pastoral Letter, "Go and Announce the Gospel of the Lord." In it Bishop Boyea identifies three different groups of people to whom we must focus our pastoral efforts; *The Household of Faith, The Lost Sheep and the Court of the Gentiles.**

As part of the Diocesan Phase of the synodal process, Pope Francis is asking us to have conversations and consultations with those in our communities in order to hear what the Holy Spirit is saying to the Church. From these conversations we will collect feedback and synthesize it into a document to be sent to the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops and then on to Rome. The Pope's desire and our hope is that this feedback will not only contribute meaningful insights to the Universal Church but also reveal ways that we can better engage in mission here in our own diocese. Bishop Boyea will be offering a short . . . homily on the weekend of February 5th and 6th to invite all attending parishes in the Diocese of Lansing to participate in this synod.

In coming weeks and months, you will be invited to engage with this process. I hope that many of us will participate, because I believe that members of this parish have wisdom to share with our own diocesan leadership and also the leadership of the Church in America and, even, around the world. Let us keep this in our prayers, and fast for wisdom for ourselves and for our brothers and sisters around the world who are united in Christ. This is, I have no need to remind you, a time of waning faith in so many places, and our desire is to more effectively fulfill the Mission for which our Lord established the Church. Come, Holy Spirit!

Band of Brothers

I invite the men of the parish to join me for the screening of the HBO Series *Band of Brothers* beginning this coming Wednesday, February 9, at 7:30 in Mercy Hall. The series is powerful in many ways, and we will encourage those who attend to engage in discussions after each week about the insights into the virtues and vices, strengths and weaknesses of the characters that are so vividly conveyed throughout the series. This viewing is for the men of the parish. Given the mature themes, we recommend that those attending these evenings be at least 18 years old, though if fathers wish to bring younger sons with them, we will respect their judgment on that. (We have a slightly edited version of one of the later episodes that eliminates some gratuitous material.) I hope that this viewing and the discussions will encourage growth in virtue among the men, young and old, of our parish. May we grow in our ability to support each other in being men of God, men for others.

This Saturday (February 12th), we will have our next *Healing Encounter*. It is a time of praise, worship, prayer, and adoration from 7:00 to 9:00 p.m. in the church. Prayer teams will be available to pray for healing and other requests. Come, and invite someone to join you.

Today in the Gospel, Jesus calls Peter, James, and John to come after him, and Jesus tells them he will make them "fishers of men." Vocations to the priesthood and consecrated life flow from lives of faith in homes, like yours. It is my daily prayer that all homes in our parish will be filled with rich spiritual soil in which the call of God can be heard and followed. May we foster vocations and respond to the call of God in our lives.

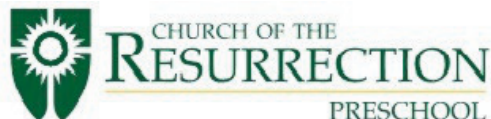

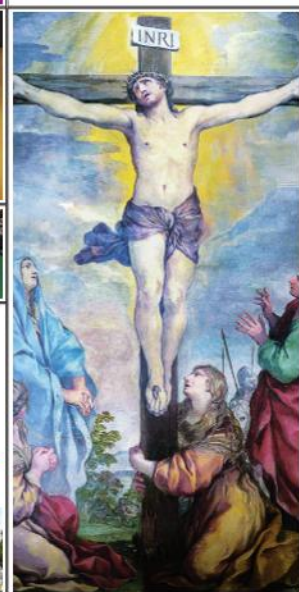
