## Technology & Social Media

Last weekend at the Sunday Masses that I preached, I spoke (again!) about the dangers and risks of technology, and most especially social media. As you have no doubt sensed, along with many technology commentators, I have serious concerns about the consequences of living in our increasingly digital world. It seems to me that the convenience of the internet and the nearly infinite ways we can spend time online are affecting our hearts and minds in ways we can't yet fully appreciate. The dangers are especially great for our children and young men and women who are, as they say, "digital natives." I hope that my homily encouraged you and your family and friends to talk about ways to "pull back" from technology use, both from the standpoint of security and the addictive nature of smart phones. Speaking in general, I can't help but believe that "less is more" when it comes to technology. My hope is that we would all prayerfully evaluate our own technological use. As we proceed, let's keep each other in prayer, most especially our young brothers and sisters.

## Beginning Lent Well

Many of you gathered Ash Wednesday to begin our Lenten Journey together. The Lord delights in the response of His people to the call to repentance and self-denial. As the Gospel Wednesday made clear, the Lord invites us to three wonderful practices during Lent. Through the Church, the Holy Spirit calls each of us to pray, fast, and give alms. The Lord says, in each instance, *when you pray, fast, and give alms*. The point is that to be Christian *is* to pray, fast, and give alms. That is what sons and daughters of God *do*, for it reveals to us what they *are* in Christ. We are called to be intimate with our Father in heaven, so we *pray*. We look forward to our home in heaven and want our appetites to be tuned to eternal things, so we *fast*. We are parts of one Body, sharing in the challenges of those around us, so we *give alms*.

## Growing in Prayer

My prayer for each of us is that we would grow in prayer this Lent. Praying to the Lord from our heart is a great practice all the time, and Lent can be a special invitation from Him to do so. The prayer of prayers is the Mass, and I encourage you to attend Mass during the week, if you've rarely (or never) taken time to do so. Another opportunity for each of us is to make a visit to Jesus sometime during the day, especially on Fridays when we have exposition throughout the day, or during our Holy Hours on Tuesday (from 7-8 p.m.) or on Friday (from 7-8 p.m.). We will also be praying the Stations of the Cross on Fridays at 6:30 p.m., which is a great Lenten tradition. Let's pray well, that we will be drawn deeper into the heart of God.

Let's all continue to pray for peace in the Ukraine. Next weekend, we will take a second collection to support those who are suffering as a result of the war in Ukraine. We will add a line in our online giving for this purpose, as well.

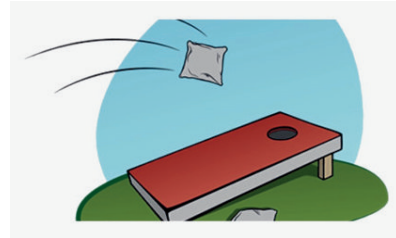

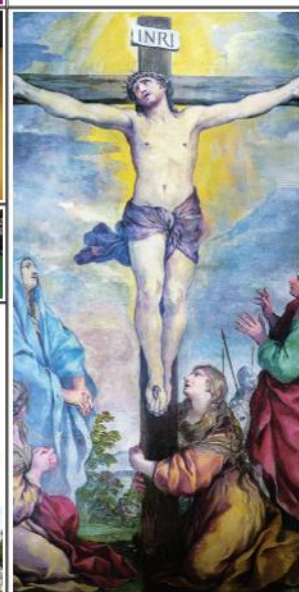
