Just as we do the third Sunday of Advent (*Gaudete* Sunday), today the priest wears "Rose" vestments. Let us, indeed, be joyful that we are sons and daughters of God through our baptism.

Consecrating the World, especially Russia and Ukraine, to the Immaculate Heart of Mary

On Friday, Pope Francis, in union with the bishops around the world, including Bishop Boyea, prayed a prayer of consecration, in keeping with the request made by Mary at Fatima in 1917. Though there have been many prayers of consecration by popes in the past, I am grateful for the gift of this world-wide prayer of consecration. Here is an excerpt of the consecratory prayer:

... Therefore, Mother of God and our Mother, to your Immaculate Heart we solemnly entrust and consecrate ourselves, the Church and all humanity, especially Russia and Ukraine. Accept this act that we carry out with confidence and love. Grant that war may end and peace spread throughout the world. The "Fiat" that arose from your heart opened the doors of history to the Prince of Peace. We trust that, through your heart, peace will dawn once more. To you we consecrate the future of the whole human family, the needs and expectations of every people, the anxieties and hopes of the world ...

Lessons from "Made for Mission"

Last weekend, I quoted from Pete Burak's reflections during the "Made for Mission" with priests and diocesan staff regarding being "on mission." I mentioned two aspects of his talk, which I said I would include this week in the bulletin. I hope that sometime soon, his talk will be available online for you to watch. But, for now, here are some excerpts from this talk:

Five Ways to Engage

- 1. Embrace Failure
- 2. Know my own story
- 3. Fasting
- 4. Heart-break/ache for people of God
- 5. Be filled with the Holy Spirit
- Seven Reasons We're Not "On Mission"
 - 1. We don't know that we should be.
 - 2. We've never seen it work/are afraid of failure
 - 3. We don't feel read, prepared.
 - 4. We are worried about what others will say (potential to lose relationships)

- 6. We separate building community from mission (*Christifideles Laici*, 32)
- 7. We don't believe it matters.

On the Vocation and the Mission of the Lay Faithful in the Church and in the World (*Christifideles Laici*, St. John Paul II, 12/30/88)

Mission to Communion

32.... Bearing fruit is an essential demand of life in Christ and life in the Church. The person who does not bear fruit does not remain in communion: "Each branch of mine that bears no fruit, he (my Father) takes away" (Jn 15: 2) Jesus says to his disciples: "You did not choose me, but I chose you and appointed you that you should go and bear fruit and that your fruit should abide" (Jn 15:16). Communion and mission are profoundly connected with each other, they interpenetrate and mutually imply each other, to the point that communion represents both the source and the fruit of mission: communion gives rise to mission and mission is accomplished in communion. It is always the one and the same Spirit who calls together and unifies the Church and sends her to preach the Gospel "to the ends of the earth" (Acts 1:8). On her part, the Church knows that the communion received by her as a gift is destined for all people In the context of Church mission, then, the Lord entrusts a great part of the responsibility to the lay faithful, in communion with all other members of the People of God . . .

Proclaiming the Gospel

33. The lay faithful, precisely because they are members of the Church, have the vocation and mission of proclaiming the Gospel: they are prepared for this work by the sacraments of Christian initiation and by the gifts of the Holy Spirit.

Confession is Good for the Soul

As a priest, I am grateful for the opportunity that the Lord has given me to serve the faithful in and through the sacrament of reconciliation. I am committed to offering confession often, and want to encourage everyone to take time this Lent to go to confession. Each Advent and Lent there is an opportunity for our city-wide communal penance services. They will be held this Sunday at 2:00 p.m. at St. Gerard and St. Thomas. As always, there will be a good number of priests at both churches to hear your confession. If it's been a while since you were last at confession, don't rob yourself or those you love of the grace of forgiveness. The Lord allows us to begin again when we go to confession. Among the best reasons for rejoicing on this *Laetare* Sunday is that the Lord is kind and merciful.
