We conclude the Octave of Easter today with the celebration of Divine Mercy Sunday. Saint John Paul the Great gave us this great Feast Day in response to the Lord's words to St. Faustina. The Lord is merciful! Indeed, *He is mercy*. There will be a celebration of Divine Mercy at St. Mary's Cathedral today (April 24) at 2:30 p.m.

#### **Divine Mercy Devotion & Indulgence**

I invite everyone to investigate the beautiful teachings about the Divine Mercy, and to entrust themselves to Jesus, as St. Faustina did. Based on private spiritual revelations given to St. Faustina, on June 29, 2002, the Holy See promulgated a decree creating new indulgences that may be gained by the faithful in connection with the celebration of Divine Mercy Sunday. This decree grants a plenary indulgence to those who comply with all the conditions established, and a partial indulgence to those who incompletely fulfill the conditions. #### **Great Cause for Rejoicing!**

Those who were present at the Easter Vigil had the tremendous privilege of witnessing three newly baptized brothers and sisters in Christ and three others who entered the Catholic Church. Congratulations to all those who have become part of our Church (and parish) family. Thank you to all of who so effectively spread the good news by word and example, and encouraged these ten brothers and sisters in their journey of faith. Let us continue to pray for them as they grow in their relationship with Jesus. (I had announced that we would have an opportunity to welcome them this Sunday, but that will be postponed. Sorry about the confusion with that.)

#### **Let MI Kids Learn Petition Drive**

The Let MI Kids Learn petition drive is underway to promote educational justice legislation. Michigan children from low-income families would qualify for "Student Opportunity Scholarships" toward their out-of-pocket educational costs at public or nonpublic schools for tutoring, school supplies, computers, and tuition among other expenses. Donors to scholarship organizations would receive a state tax credit. Low-income parishioners and members of our community would benefit from this initiated legislation, regardless of where they send their children to school. The petitions would place this proposal before the legislature, and, if approved, would not require the governor's signature to become law. As this is a nonpartisan effort,

Catholic parishes and schools are allowed to circulate petitions. The Catholic Bishops of Michigan support this effort. Please prayerfully consider signing the two required petitions to create the scholarship program and tax credits to improve the education of Michigan's school children. Registered voters will be able to sign petitions this weekend after Mass. Please note that there are two different petitions (a green and a blue one). This will be available in the vestibule on Saturday evening, and in the Parish Hall after the morning Masses. Thank you in advance.

#### **Diocesan Services Appeal**

Thank you to those 80 households who have made a pledge or gift to DSA, totaling \$42,000. That gets us to about 40% of our goal of \$105,981. At this point, only 13 percent of households have made a pledge. Please prayerfully consider making a pledge or gift. even a small one, to show our support of the bishop and the very good team he has working with him at the Diocesan Center. As always, please let me know if you have concerns or questions about how your DSA funds might be used.

#### The Peace of Forgiveness

Today in our Gospel, Jesus appears to the Apostles, and says, "Peace be with you." That's His desire for each of us—that we would experience peace that surpasses human understanding. He said "Peace be with you" a second time, and then breathed on them, saying "Receive the Holy Spirit. Whose sins you forgive are forgiven them; whose sins you retain are retained." In that special outpouring of the Holy Spirit upon the apostles, the Church sees the institution of the Sacrament of Penance. And He gave it to us the very day He rose from the dead—so much did He know our need! As a priest I know the power of the words of absolution; I've felt the impact as a penitent myself, and I've witnessed the freedom of other penitents when they have confessed their sins and received absolution. Divine Mercy is our hope!
