Independence Day

The parish office will be closed July 4th. Please pray for our nation, especially that our Religious Liberties will be respected long into the future. (Confessions & Mass will resume on Thursday, July 7, after I return.)

What a day, what a decision!

After nearly five decades, the scourge of Roe v. Wade has finally come to a legal end, and a vindication of federalism has rightly triumphed. Thank God for the courage, wisdom, and integrity of the Supreme Court justices who have voted to overturn the 1973 decision that, even at that time, was seen as an exercise of raw judicial power. Some precedents need to be overturned because they are bad decisions. Such was Roe, just like Plessy-Ferguson in 1954, before it. Bad precedents rightly get overturned, and thanks be to God, the decision that was leaked months ago was finally released on perhaps the most perfect day possible: the Solemnity of the Sacred Heart of Jesus, which was coincident this year, for the first time in over sixty years, with the Nativity of St. John the Baptist (June 24). Our prayers have been answered. The long Lent of legalized abortion as a "constitutional right" has ended. Of course, that doesn't mean that the battle is ended, but the March for Life in January need no longer be celebrated. Perhaps we will begin calling June, as some have said, "Life Month." It is already the Month of the Sacred Heart. And this year, Our Lord and Our Lady, the Immaculate Heart of Mary, have triumphed, in and through faithful justices, many of whom are Catholic themselves. Please note that they did not make this decision because they are Catholic, but because Catholics who honor faith and reason will seek the good, the true, and the beautiful.

Fear-based, Satan-inspired, Response from the Activist Left

I am struck, though not surprised, by the fear-based, violence-baiting talk from commentators and politicians of the Activist Left. Let us pray for those who are suffering from irrational fear of this decision, and who seem to really believe that freedom is impossible without the freedom for women (and girls) to kill babies in the womb until the moment of birth. Their view is, without hyperbole, demonic. The devil hates babies as well as women because they can have babies. Pray for those who are deceived by the Deceiver! Come, Holy Spirit!

Threats of Violence; Safety at Mass

Just as we did on the weekend of Mother's Day, we are anticipating potential disruptions this weekend. As we did last week, we are planning to have the doors locked shortly after Mass begins to avoid disruptions during Mass. All of that to say, please arrive early, if you can. We'll have the ushers in the vestibule let people in if they are locked after Mass starts. The side doors will also be locked, so plan to come to the vestibule to gain access after Mass begins. It's sad that we have to do this, but I am grateful that we are the bearers of the truth in the face of the hostility and lies of those who believe that abortion is "health care." Come, Holy Spirit!
