Organ Update

The day after we celebrated Corpus Christi, a team from Renaissance Pipe Organ Company in Ann Arbor came to begin work on refurbishing our organ. They removed all of our organ pipes and dismantled the organ console, which is going to be entirely rewired. The pipes are having new leathers installed. The organ will be out of commission for another two months or so. It may take longer, and as hard as it is to go without it, I am pleased that we are having this work done. Thank you for your patience as we endure this period of going without our great organ. Please pray that all goes well.

Instruments at Mass

I know that not a few individuals and families who attend the 11:00 a.m. Mass were disappointed and some may even have been scandalized to hear the piano as the supporting instrument for worship. One person asked if using an instrument other than organ was allowed in terms of Church liturgical documents. The short answer is yes. Though *Sacrosanctum Concilium* does make clear that the organ should retain pride of place in Catholic worship, liturgical documents do allow for the use of other instruments, such as piano, guitar, and other wind and string instruments at Mass.

Reminder: Summer Office Hours

After talking with those who are covering the office in the morning, we decided to shift the opening time from 8:00 a.m. to 9:00 a.m. Monday through Thursday during the summer. So the office hours will be Monday through Thursday 9:00 to 12:00 and 12:30 to 4:30 p.m. The office is closed on Fridays. This change will allow those who cover the office to attend daily Mass. We'll return to 8:00 a.m. to open the office when school resumes in August.

Helping the Homeless

Last weekend, I referenced the challenges of dealing with homeless and needy individuals whom we encounter in the area and/or who happen to stop by the church on Sundays and throughout the week. It's not easy to know how best to respond to requests for help. Please pray that we will have wisdom as we discuss ways to more effectively partner with St. Vincent de Paul and other area ministries to provide real support to those who are in need. Many of you know the "regulars" who come by, especially on Sundays. We don't know what's happening in their hearts, of course, but the call is always to treat them with love. Please do pray for them.

Unfortunately, some of the "regulars" have a habit of asking for a little bit of money. Please refrain from giving money to them. We don't want to create a pattern of begging at Mass. Please encourage them to contact the St. Vincent de Paul Society for assistance. If you have small denomination gift cards or food to give them, and wish to give that to them, feel free. But, again, please refrain from giving them cash. And keep on praying for them! Thanks.
