Sunday Excerpts

Last weekend, in my homily, I quoted from a spiritual commentary on the Gospel of Matthew by Erasmo Leiva-Merikakis. The book is entitled, *Fire of Love: Heart of the Word*, by Ignatius Press. This is the commentary on Matthew's parallel text to the Gospel from last Sunday. I trust that you will find them as challenging and edifying as I did:

"I have not come to bring peace upon the earth": peace is something that cannot be imposed from above, even by God. Peace must be the result of a process of purification and regeneration occurring interiorly within the heart and soul either of a person or of society. The "sword" that Jesus brings instead of worldly "peace" is a therapeutic weapon. This sword is none other than God's terrible and fiery Word, which Jesus personally is:

"The Word of God is alive and active. It cuts more keenly than any two-edged sword, piercing as far as the place where soul and spirit, joints and marrow, divide. It sifts the purposes and thoughts of the heart" (Heb 4:12).... All of these passages indicate that Jesus did not come to bring comfort but life, and this by the infusion of his holy Word, whose work effects a thorough and therefore frightening interior transformation of everything it touches. To the dead, the infusion of vibrant life must feel like a merciless violence. We have here an experience of redemption that is not only spiritual but physiological, totally transformative of the whole man. It was for nothing else that the eternal Word of the Father took on flesh: it was for this that Jesus came into our midst. The healing he brings from his Father does not look or feel like the peace this world gives, and this is why his peace is compatible with tribulation, as he says in John (16:33).

Christ, the divine hero, comes at man brandishing the sword of God's Word. Christ's sword comes to destroy our illusions, our self-deceptions, and to open in our being a blessed wound that will be our clear window to truth and to love.
