Save the Date! Resurrection Life Course Begins October 20

Our Resurrection Life course is a 5-week course created by the Church of the Resurrection. It presents the wonderful message of the gospel and offers participants with a way of opening themselves to the powerful and liberating experience of new life in Christ through the Holy Spirit. The course begins on October 20. The format for each evening includes a meal, short prayer time, a talk, discussion time, and closes with a final prayer. The night begins at 6:30 pm and ends at 8:30 pm. The course includes a Friday-Saturday offsite experience at the Colombiere Retreat Center in Clarkston, Michigan. The sessions cover topics such as God the Father, God the Son, God the Holy Spirit, forgiveness, the Gifts of the Holy Spirit, and Life Everlasting. You can register online. The dates of the course sessions are: Oct. 20 & 27, Nov. 3, Nov. 11-12 (off-site), Nov. 17. This is a great opportunity to grow deeper in your own faith, or to invite others who may not know the Lord to come, spend some time with others, and to have an encounter with the love of God.


