Proposal 3

Please continue to talk with others about Proposal 3 and the dangers that it presents for our boys, girls, and women in our state. This is from the Diocese:

Proponents of Proposal 3 want you to think that this proposed amendment to the Michigan Constitution will restore Roe. This is false. Proposal 3 goes far beyond restoring Roe. Dozens of Michigan laws designed to protect the health and safety of Michigan women and children could be negated under Proposal 3. Proposal 3 eliminates parental consent for abortion, sterilization, and hormone therapies (including gender "transition" therapies). It permits abortion up until the moment of birth (including partialbirth abortion). It eliminates the Michigan law that requires abortions be performed by licensed physicians and allows any "health care professional" to perform them. And it also eliminates Health and Safety regulations for abortion facilities. You may be wondering where, in Proposal 3, those things are listed. Please take the handout

"Where Does it Say That?" as you are leaving. Take extra for your friends and family to help show that Proposal 3 hurts Michigan.

4 Talking Points

Eliminates parental consent for abortion, sterilization, and hormone therapies (including cross-sex hormones) Permits abortion through all 9 months, including partial-birth abortion Eliminates Michigan law that requires only licensed physicians perform abortions and allows any "health care professional" to perform them Eliminates health and safety regulations on

Eliminates health and safety regulations on abortion facilities One of the main things we need to remember is that this goes FAR BEYOND Roe, and that dozens of Michigan laws designed to protect the health and safety of Michigan women and children could be negated. The one page MCC "explainer," along with the "Focus" from MCC on Proposal 3, are available at the various exits in the church.

Sanctuary Renovation Update

As I mentioned a few weeks ago at Mass, we have been working with our new architect on getting the final design ready for diocesan review, before moving on to construction plans. We will be working with another liturgical design firm to work on design for the altar, ambo, tabernacle, etc., and look forward to moving forward with the project, as I mentioned a few weeks ago sometime in 2023. The earliest would be after Easter, but it may be more likely that the project would be done in the fall of next year. We desire to move forward as soon as possible, and we invite your prayers as we proceed. Thank you for your generosity and your patience, as we have been longanticipating work to be done.

2023 GUIDELINES FOR SCHEDULING MASS INTENTIONS

POLICY & PROCEDURE

- Mass stipends are \$10 and are to be paid when requesting Masses. Payable by check or exact change only.
- Limit of 6 Masses per parish family may be requested for the year, (up to 2 of these can be for the Sunday obligation)
- Only 1 intention per Mass is allowed, per Canon Law. However, to better accommodate the needs of our parishioners, we can list up to <u>2 first names</u> with the same last name (i.e. John & Mary Smith)
 OR <u>2 last names</u> (i.e. Jones & Smith Families)
- No Mass will be permanently affixed in the Mass Book until the stipend is received.
- ° The first stipend received is assigned the date.

SPECIAL NOTES TO REMEMBER

- One Sunday Mass per weekend is offered for the intention of the Parishioners of Resurrection.
- Have an alternate date/time in mind.
- Please note that scheduled Masses may need to be moved to another date/time due to the availability of our priest.
- All Mass intentions over 6 requests will be sent to a Mission assigned by the Diocese.


