Reflections on the Election

Thank you to everyone who has joined the bishop in praying the 54 Day Novena. As you surely know by now, Proposal 3 passed despite our tremendous prayer and efforts. The Lord is pleased with our support of life and defense of the truth about the dignity of human life and proper limits on abortion and sterilization. For reasons we cannot understand, the Lord allowed our citizenry to pass Proposal 3. What we need to do is continue to witness to the truth in our world, to be the light in our dark time. We may feel anger at others who drafted the language, contributed and or promoted the campaign, and those who were deceptive in describing the effects of the proposal. Let's continue to pray for those who will suffer as a result of this newly created "right," including children (and their parents), girls, women, and medical care professionals, to name a few. Lord, have mercy!

What's Next?

It's fairly clear from a review of exit polls nationwide that Generation Z, as they are called, voted significantly for so-called "progressive" policies and candidates. As we proceed, the key is to shore up our parish community in the truth as we find it in Christ and through the Church. Cursing the darkness and demonizing those we disagree with is not what is called for. Neither would it be effective. The key, it seems to me, is for us to continue to do what we are committed to doing: Being Mission-Focused, Authentically Catholic, and Supportive of Families. These are our Core Values, and we are recommitting to them. The key for us is to live as witnesses in our world. As we do, and support each other in that, I believe that children will "catch" the faith more effectively. Let's recommit to being faithful, and supporting each other in living out the faith. As we do, let's bathe ourselves and our community in prayer, trusting the Lord's leading, day by day.


