Healing Prayers Against Anger

Last Sunday, I preached about the temptation to anxiety, which is often bound up with the sin of anger. The prayer I shared in the homily was the following: In the name of Jesus Christ, I renounce the sin of anger, and any idolatry of power, control or justice. I renounce all bitterness, judgments, and retaliation. I ask for your forgiveness Lord, and I choose instead the virtue of patience and long-suffering, to bless those who hurt me. "Emmanuel: God Is With Us"

On this Fourth Sunday of Advent, the Church gives us a foretaste of the glory of Christmas, as we recall the birth of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ. The birth of Jesus is an answer to an Old Testament prophecy, recounted today in our first reading from the Book of the Prophet Isaiah. The story of the prophecy and its fulfillment is one of faith, hope, and love. A story of prayerfulness and trust, of God's faithfulness, and a reminder of the power of joyful hope. As we anticipate these last few days of waiting, may we and all those we love be encouraged by the faithfulness of God who comes to be truly "with us" in our hearts and homes.

As we anticipate the celebration of Christ's birth, I want to thank all of you for your prayerful support of me as your pastor. Thanks too for the material support you have given to the ministry of the Church of the Resurrection. Because of your gifts of time, talent, and treasure, we are able to spread the Good News in our parish, school, and community. I am excited about our prayerful review of the promptings of the Lord in terms of God's vision for the Church of the Resurrection and Resurrection School for the next decade and beyond, and invite you to continue to provide feedback about how we might more effectively fulfill the spiritual and corporal works of mercy in the heart of the city. Indeed, I have felt a great sense of openness to the Spirit here and look forward with anticipation to what the Lord has in store for us in 2023. May we all be open to God's leading, and grow together in our knowledge, love, and practice of our faith.

Special Event: Twelfth Night

Next month, we have planned a parish cultural event, which we hope to have on an annual basis, called the Twelfth Night Celebration. The event will take place from 6:30 p.m. on January 7 and is a celebration of the great gift of Christ's manifestation at Christmas and Epiphany. It will be set on a Saturday closest to the twelfth day/night of the Christmas season during Epiphanytide. Mercy Hall will be decked out as something resembling a pub(!). Adults in the parish and friends are invited to join us for an evening of songs, music, and poetry that will inspire and entertain in equal measure. The Twelfth Night has been a traditional celebration since before medieval times, particularly in Europe, and involves the consumption of abundant food and drink as well as performances to honor the birth of our Savior. You can sign-up to join us on our website. Space is limited, so register early. (We look forward to having other cultural events throughout the year, some of which will be open to the whole family, but again, this one is for adults.) I hope to see you there!

Christmas & New Year's Mass Schedule

Next Sunday, we celebrate our Church's second highest feast, the Nativity of our Lord Jesus Christ. Even if they don't typically come to Mass, your friends and family will probably feel the urge to come to church. Consider inviting them to join you as we gather together to rejoice in Our Newborn King. On Christmas Eve, we will have our typical 8:15 a.m. Mass. There will be Masses at 5:00 and Midnight (prelude music will commence at 11:30 p.m.). On Christmas Day, there will be one Christmas Day Mass at 11:00 a.m. Bishop Boyea will be the celebrant, in celebration of one hundred years since the first Mass. (NB: There will be no 5:00 p.m. Mass on Sunday, December 25.) For obvious reasons, we won't have coffee & donuts after Mass next weekend.
