Formation Opportunities

Please carve out time to join us in a couple of weeks for presentations which will be held February 15-17. Fr. Sean Kilcawley, a priest of the Diocese of Lincoln, Nebraska, will be in Lansing to present to students, parents, and teachers about the challenges of growing up (and forming children) in the 21st Century. We can't really exaggerate the challenges of living (and growing up and raising children) in what he (rightly) calls a hyper-sexualized culture. Fr. Kilcawley studied at the JPII Institute for Marriage and Family and has certification as a Pastoral Sexual Addiction *Practitioner* from the International Institute for Trauma and addictions professionals. His presentation to parents will be Wednesday evening at 7:00 p.m. in the Lansing Catholic HS auditorium. The title of his talk that .evening will be "Living the Gospel of the Family." Pope Benedict XVI once wrote, "In our times as in times past, the eclipse of God, the spread of ideologies contrary to the family and the degradation of sexual ethics are connects. And just as the eclipse of God and the crisis of the family are linked, so the new evangelization is inseparable from the Christian family." In this talk Fr Kilcawley will unpack these words from Pope Benedict and provide tools and insight to *help parents in their role as leaders of the domestic Church in the midst of the hyper-sexualized culture.* On Thursday morning, he will give a presentation to middle school and high school students from 9:15 to 11:15 a.m. in the church. The title of his talk is "Jesus Is Enough for You." He will also give a formation session for teachers on Friday. Please pray for Fr. Kilcawley and for those who will hear him present during his three day visit next week. And join us, if you're able!

Mere Christianity

This past weekend, I read these excerpts from the end of *Mere Christianity*. The chapter focuses on the personality that we have when we yield to the Lord, and find our true personality in Him. These last paragraphs are worth reflection:

At the beginning I said there were Personalities in God. I will go further now. There are no real personalities anywhere else. Until you have given up your self to Him you will not have a real self. Sameness is to be found most among the most 'natural' men, not among those who surrender to Christ. How monotonously alike all the great tyrants and conquerors have been: how gloriously different are the saints. But there must be a real giving up of the self. You must throw it away 'blindly' so to speak. Christ will indeed give you a real personality: but you must not go to Him for the sake of that. As long as your own personality is what you are bothering about you are not going to Him at all. The very first step is to try to forget about the self altogether. Your real, new self (which is Christ's and also yours, and yours just because it is His) will not come as long as you are looking for it. It will come when you are looking for Him. Does that sound strange? The same principle holds, you know, for more everyday matters. Even in social life, you will never make a good impression on other people until *you stop thinking about what sort of impression you* are making. Even in literature and art, no man who bothers about originality will ever be original: whereas if you simply try to tell the truth (without caring twopence how often it has been told before) you will, nine times out of ten, become original without ever having noticed it. The principle runs through all life from top to bottom. Give up yourself, and you will find your real self. Lose your life and you will save it. Submit to death, death of your ambitions and favourite wishes every day and death of your whole body in the end: submit with every fibre of your being, and you will find eternal life. Keep back nothing. Nothing that you have not given away will be really yours. Nothing in you that has not died will ever be raised from the dead. Look for yourself, and you will find in the long run only hatred, loneliness, despair, rage, ruin, and decay. But look for Christ and you will find Him, and with Him everything else thrown in. (C.S. Lewis, Mere Christianity, pp. 226-227).
