Praying for the Dead

November is a month when we remember our loved ones who have died. There is a book near the statue of Mary (and the baptismal font) for you to list family members whom you wish to remember in prayer this month. Please note that I will offer also offer Mass at 11:00 a.m., November 11, for all parishioners who have died between November 2, 2022 and November 1, 2023. If you have a loved one who has died this past year, please let Meredith know, and we will include your loved one in the Eucharistic Prayer as we pray for the dead by name. Feel free, of course, to invite families to join us for this Mass. Every time we pray for the dead, we perform one of the spiritual works of mercy. May they rest in peace!

St. Augustine on Loving God and Neighbor

Last Sunday, in my Sunday homilies, I quoted from St. Augustine on the "hierarchy of loves" or the "order of loves." His thoughts seem worth continued prayerful reflection:

But living a just and holy life requires one to be capable of an objective and impartial evaluation of things: to love things, that is to say, in the right order, so that you do not love what is not to be loved, or fail to love what is to be loved, or have a greater love for what should be loved less, or an equal love for things that should be loved less or more, or a lesser or greater love for things that should be loved equally. (St. Augustine, On Christian Doctrine, I.27-28)

St. Augustine called virtues "the various movements of love," and described the four cardinal virtues in terms of love:

I hold that virtue is nothing other than perfect love of God. Now, when it is said that virtue has a fourfold division, as I understand it, this is said according to the various movements of love...We may, therefore, define these virtues as follows: temperance is love preserving itself entire and incorrupt for God; courage is love readily bearing all things for the sake of God; justice is love serving only God, and therefore ruling well everything else that is subject to the human person; prudence is love discerning well between what helps it toward God and what hinders it. (On the Morals of the Catholic Church, XV.25)

Our Lady of Akita

At the 5:00 p.m. Saturday Mass, I referenced an alleged Eucharistic Miracle, which is said to have occurred on October 13, 2023 in California at a Mission that Fr. Chris Alar, MIC was conducting on Mary and the Eucharist. The image that appeared in the large monstrance bore a resemblance to Our Lady of Akita, which occurred on the 50th anniversary of her last message to Sr. Agnes. The message of Akita is similar to that of Fatima, where the Miracle of the Sun occurred on October 13, 1917. The message was repent from sin, make reparations for sin, and pray the Rosary. Let us wisely follow Our Lady's exhortation, and prepare well for whatever may come by repenting, avoiding sin and making reparation for sin, and praying the Rosary in union with her and all the saints. May we heed message of warning not as reasons for fear, but out of a sense of being reminded that we are made for a more perfect, eternal world beyond this one. So, as we come to the end of the Liturgical Year, we say with the Church in Revelations, "Come, Lord Jesus, Come!" It is well to add, "Come, Holy Spirit!" and "Lord, have mercy!"

2024 GUIDELINES FOR SCHEDULING MASS INTENTIONS

POLICY & PROCEDURE

- Mass stipends are \$10 and are to be paid when requesting Masses. Payable by check or exact change only.
- ♦ Limit of 6 Masses per parish family may be
- requested for the year, (up to 2 of these can be for the Sunday obligation)
- Only 1 intention per Mass is allowed, per Canon Law. However, to better accommodate the needs of our parishioners, we can list up to <u>2 first</u> <u>names with the same last name</u> (e.g. John & Mary Smith) **OR** <u>2 last names</u> (e.g. Jones & Smith Families)
- No Mass will be permanently affixed in the Mass Book until the stipend is received.
- ° The first stipend received is assigned the date.

SPECIAL NOTES TO REMEMBER

- One Sunday Mass per weekend is offered for the intention of the Parishioners of Resurrection.
- ♦ Have an alternate date/time in mind.
- Please note that scheduled Masses may need to be moved to another date/time due to the availability of our priest.
- All Mass intentions over 6 requests will be sent to a Mission assigned by the Diocese.

The 2023 Mass Book will be open Monday, November 6, 2023.

Resurrection St. Vincent DePaul continues to serve our neighbors.

Our fiscal year ended September 2023 and within that timeframe we helped 1836 families; 1178 adults and 658 children.

We help people with variety of ways. One major way that we assist our neighbors is providing them with food. Much of our food is purchased from the Greater Lansing Food Bank at a cost of \$800-\$1000 per month.

Another source of food comes from the Meijer Simply Give program. This program is funded by donations from our parishioners.

The Lake Lansing Meijer gives us a time frame, this year it is October 1 through December 30th in which people can purchase a \$10 donation card (or more...in increments of \$10) at the store in the check-out lane. Meijer matches each donation, so a \$10 donation becomes \$20..etc. Meijer will DOUBLE MATCH on ONE day during the campaign...this year it's SATURDAY, DECEMBER 16th. We are encouraging cash donations be given directly to St. Vincent....then we will take donated funds to the store on the DOUBLE match day.

If you would like to make a donation, please put it in a separate envelope marked St. Vincent and place in the collection basket or drop it off at the office.

Your help allows us to be the helping hands of Jesus and to try to spread His love in this broken world in which we live.


