

Happy New Year!

As we celebrate the new (liturgical) year and begin our Advent journey, I hope and pray that all of our hearts will be filled with joyful anticipation of Christ's three-fold coming: 1) His coming as a baby, the "Newborn King"; 2) His coming again in Glory; and 3) His coming into our hearts.

Tithing (Giving God His Portion)

As I mentioned last Sunday, Malachi tells us to test the Lord. Here's the text of Malachi again. It's worth meditation and prayer. Some of you can tell stories about your own decision to tithe. Thank you for your generosity and your witness of faith!

Malachi 3:8 Can anyone rob God? But you are robbing me! And you say, "How have we robbed you?" Of tithes and contributions! 9 You are indeed accursed, for you, the whole nation, rob me. 10 Bring the whole tithe into the storehouse, That there may be food in my house. Put me to the test, says the LORD of hosts, and see if I do not open the floodgates of heaven for you, and pour down upon you blessing without measure! 11 I will rebuke the locust for you so that it will not destroy your crops, and the vine in the field will not be barren, says the LORD of hosts. 12 All the nations will call you blessed, for you will be a delightful land, says the LORD of hosts.

The principle in Malachi is premised on the obvious truth that God is the source of all we have, and our ability to make money comes from Him. Giving God "His Portion" first is an act of worship, which many of you have already committed to doing. Thank you! Others of you may be able to tithe, but might believe that the parish is doing well, so there isn't really a need for your financial support. But because of the expense of replacing the entrance/portico of our original church building, which is now the preschool, we passed a deficit budget of almost \$260,000. Our savings is good, so we are not concerned about that, but an increase in offertory would allow us to cover those costs, and future deferred maintenance costs without having to dip into our savings. I have said this before, but if we were really to become a "stewardship parish," marked by

tithing, we would be able to do more ministry and even possibly get to the place where families would not be charged tuition (beyond a relatively modest "co-pay") for school here. We would not charge for other events, either. I would say that the "sky is the limit" of what ministry might be able to do, if we all tithed.

Taking the "Generosity Challenge"

In the pews this week and next, you will find a card that I encourage you to pray about, fill out, and put in the offertory or drop it by the office. What I'm inviting us each to do is to look at our giving from this past year, and then pray. After prayer, please make a commitment to an amount that you are hoping to be able to give in 2024 in support of our ministry, as a response of faith and obedience to the Lord. Another option would be to fill out the information online. One way to fulfill this commitment is to enroll in online giving, which is the easiest way to ensure that you are fulfilling your commitment. That way, when a parishioner is away, the parish continues to receive support.

Are You Ready? He's Coming!

The Lord is someday (perhaps soon) coming again. Indeed, *Advent* means "coming." Today, Jesus warns us to "Be watchful! Be alert!" as we anticipate His return. He invites us to travel this journey with joy. May you and your family know the love, joy, and peace of the Lord this Advent.

Resurrection St. Vincent DePaul continues to serve our neighbors.

Our fiscal year ended September 2023 and within that timeframe we helped 1836 families; 1178 adults and 658 children.

We help people with variety of ways. One major way that we assist our neighbors is providing them with food. Much of our food is purchased from the Greater Lansing Food Bank at a cost of \$800-\$1000 per month.

Another source of food comes from the Meijer Simply Give program. This program is funded by donations from our parishioners.

The Lake Lansing Meijer gives us a time frame, this year it is October 1 through December 30th in which people can purchase a \$10 donation card (or more...in increments of \$10) at the store in the check-out lane. Meijer matches each donation, so a \$10 donation becomes \$20..etc. Meijer will DOUBLE MATCH on ONE day during the campaign...this year it's SATURDAY, DECEMBER 16th. We are encouraging cash donations be given directly to St. Vincent....then we will take donated funds to the store on the DOUBLE match day.


If you would like to make a donation, please put it in a separate envelope marked St. Vincent and place in the collection basket or drop it off at the office.
