Rejoice!

This, the fourth Sunday of Lent, is called by that name because of the beginning of the opening antiphon for today's Mass: "*Laetare* Jerusalem," which is translated, "Rejoice, Jerusalem!" And we do rejoice. We are at the midway point of this season of penance, looking forward to the celebration of the holiest week of the Christian year. Just as we do the third Sunday of Advent (*Gaudete* Sunday), today the priest wears "Rose" vestments. Let us, indeed, be joyful that we are sons and daughters of God through our baptism.

A Successful Deanery Mission

I'm very pleased that we had such a great turnout for the recent Deanery Lenten Mission, which was held at St. Thomas Aquinas this past week. Dr. Mary Healy gave presentations and led a healing service for us, focused on the Holy Spirit. St. Thomas Aquinas live-streamed the sessions, and they will be available for thirty days. I'm grateful to our staff members who worked so hard with staff members from other Deanery parishes. Sean and Liz O'Neill along with Debbie McPherson did a great job of organizing the event. St. Thomas staff did a wonderful job hosting, and keeping track of all the various logistical needs. Thanks to the music teams that led us well in worship, and the prayer team members who prayed with those who attended. Together we prayed, "Come, Holy Spirit!" And, no surprise: He came. Thanks be to God.

Compline (Sunday, March 10 at 7:00 p.m.)

Compline (from the word for "completion"), the last liturgy of prayers of the day, has been prayed in monasteries since the 6th century. It is a fitting end to *Laetare* Sunday. Under musical director David Stattelman, the Schola at the Church of the Resurrection approaches chanting *Compline* from the medieval style and perspective, that is, a fluid style with strong emphasis on conveying the meaning of the text and often with the addition vocal drones. The result is an experience listeners describe as "ethereal" and "contemplative". The church will be darkened. There will be print-outs at the South and East entrances you may use as a guide; this will have both the Latin and English. You may follow along with the guide or simply sit and listen. Join us, if you're able.

Church Renovation Townhall Meeting (March 18)

As I mentioned last week, we are hoping to be able to get started with our renovations two weeks after Easter. We are making plans for the duration of the time when we will not be able to use the church, and want to share those plans with you and to hear your questions and comments about them. We will have a meeting on Monday, March 18, at 7:00 p.m. in Mercy Hall to discuss our plans and to hear your comments. Join us if you are able. No need to RSVP.

Tentative Plans

At this point we are planning to have daily Masses (Monday, Wednesday, Thursday, Friday and Saturday morning) in Mercy Hall, along with confessions, which will be heard in the east end conference room. Lansing Catholic High School has graciously allowed us to have Masses in their beautiful chapel, and we have tentatively planned to have three morning Masses on Sundays, at 8:00 a.m., 9:30 a.m., and 11:30 a.m., the times we used during Covid. It may take some time to figure out how to divide ourselves up evenly to fit in their smaller space, but I trust that we will make adjustments ourselves without having to register for Masses. Their chapel seats around 285. Note that for the duration of the construction, we will not have either the Saturday evening or Sunday evening Masses at LCHS. That will allow us to open and close Lansing Catholic High School just once each weekend. Those who prefer evening Saturday or Sunday Masses will (of course) have the option of attending other area Masses. I'm hopeful that one of the morning Mass times will work for most parishioners. These arrangements will obviously have to be for the duration of the renovation work, which could be five months or more. We are hoping to have it completed in late August or early September, but we can't make any guarantees. It goes without saying that this will be a hardship for everyone, and will require sacrifices and accommodations. I think I can speak for most of us when I say that I look forward to the finished project. In this Lenten season, I find myself seeing this period of sacrifice as a long "passion" that will lead to a rebirth/renewal of our church. If you would, please keep the project and each other in prayer. Thanks!
