#### **Offertory Deficit**

As I mentioned in early May, our offertory has been down since the beginning of the renovation project. Thanks for all of you who have responded with additional giving. Through the end of May, our offertory is about \$19,000 behind our budgeted amount. Many of you (including me) give by way of our online portal, and I encourage everyone who feels comfortable doing so, to consider that option. Online giving or other automated giving options help ensure that the amount that parishioners plan to give is received each week, month, or year. As a parish, we are committed to using the funds that we are given with good stewardship, and I invite all of us to revisit our giving, and, for those who are able, to consider prayerfully increasing our giving. In any case, please pray for wisdom for all households, that we would do the Lord's bidding in this regard, trusting, as we are told in scripture, that we cannot out-give God. I would love to be able, if at all possible, to finish our fiscal year strong. As you know, we conclude our fiscal year June 30 each year. Thank you for your ongoing generous support of our ministry.

#### **Attending Mass While Traveling**

As summer begins, many of us will be traveling on vacations or weekends away. As you all know, we have an obligation to attend Mass each Sunday (or Saturday evening) each week, if we are at all able to do so. If it is impossible, the obligation does not bind, but ordinarily we can find a Mass wherever we might be traveling. I encourage you to make Sunday Mass a part of your weekends while away. If you are not sure how to find Mass times elsewhere, a great resource is "masstimes.org," which has Mass times and confession times for the entire United States. If, however, you are unable, for whatever reason, to attend Mass while traveling, you are allowed a traveler's dispensation from the obligation. A pastor can grant that ahead of time, as well. If you are unable to attend Mass, it would be very valuable for you yourself and/or with your family to take time reading through and reflecting on the readings for the Sunday you are unable to attend Mass. These are important ways to convey to, especially children, the importance and priority that we make to honoring the Lord on the Lord's Day. Have a wonderful summer, filled with re-creation and renewal.

#### **Reverence at Mass (Summer Attire Edition)**

As we anticipate the beauty of summer, it is well, to remind everyone about the importance of dressing appropriately for Mass. Most especially on the weekends, shorts are not appropriate attire for worship. Ideally, we would never wear jeans either, in the summer or the rest of the year. Imagine that we are (for we ARE) coming into the presence of our Lord. What would we wear to meet Him and to receive Him "under our roof"? I'm confident that we would wear our "Sunday best" in order to honor Him. Let's encourage each other, and dress modestly and appropriately this summer. This is especially true of those who are exercising various ministries at Mass. Thank you.

#### **Prayer of Deliverance**

This weekend, our first reading is from Genesis, which outlines the consequences/judgment upon Adam and Eve (and all who are their children) after the Fall. Division within communities and families began way back then, stoked and stirred by the lies of the Evil One. Jesus is, as we all know, the answer to the strife and divisions within families, communities, nations, and the world. He is the remedy for sin and all the effects of sin in our lives and world. Because of the triumph of Jesus over sin and death, we who are in Christ through our baptism, can take authority over the evil one and pray against the power of the enemy in our lives and homes. Here is a prayer from the book we gave out at Easter, that would be helpful for everyone to pray (Prayer of Deliverance):

Almighty God and Father, we beg Thee through the intercession and help of the Archangels Sts. Michael, Raphael, and Gabriel, for the deliverance of our brothers and sisters who are enslaved by the evil one. All Saints of Heaven, come to our aid. From anxiety, sadness and obsessions – We implore Thee, deliver us, O Lord. From hatred, fornication, and envy – We implore Thee, deliver us, O Lord. From thoughts of jealousy, rage, and death – We implore Thee, deliver us, O Lord. From every thought of suicide and abortion – We implore Thee, deliver us, O Lord. From every form of sinful sexuality – We implore Thee, deliver us, O Lord. From every division in our family, and every harmful friendship –We implore Thee, deliver us, O Lord. From every sort of spell, malefice, witchcraft, and every form of the occult – We implore Thee, deliver us, O Lord. Thou who said, "Peace I leave with you, my peace I give unto you." Grant that, through the intercession of the Virgin Mary, we may be liberated from every demonic influence and enjoy Thy peace always. In the Name of Christ, our Lord. Amen.

This prayer and every prayer of deliverance should be prayed out loud, not merely read or prayed silently. Speaking these prayers and promises out loud has a real, liberating influence on us and those we love. I recommend that people look through the book, and to pray the prayers that the Lord inspires you to pray, not, of course, out of fear, but as tools that can help free us to receive and give love as we were intended, so that we can, as Jesus says this Sunday, do the will of the Father.


