Beauty of Creation

I'm writing this column at a campground near Grand Marais in upper Michigan. It's a great day, filled with beauty and God's blessings. I look forward to returning home refreshed by God's goodness to me in and through the beauty of creation. During my time away, I have given God thanks that I am beginning my thirteenth year as your pastor. As I reflect on the past twelve years, I can see that God has been very faithful. Though we are still very much a parish and school "in progress" (as I am myself!), the Lord has blessed us richly. Among God's many blessings, being pastor at the Church of the Resurrection is among God's greatest gifts to me. Be assured of my daily prayers for you. Please pray for me. Come, Holy Spirit!

Prayers for Vocations

Jesus tells us this: "The harvest is abundant but the laborers are few; so ask the master of the harvest to send out laborers for his harvest." There's no doubt that we have great need for laborers for the harvest. All of us are called to be "co-laborers" in the vineyard of the Lord, but we definitely are called to raise up boys and men who are open to the great gift to be a priest. I am now in my twentieth year as a priest, and am more excited about my priestly ministry than ever before. Families, thank you for your openness to life. Can I encourage you to pray that your sons and daughters would pray for discernment about their vocation? Encourage your sons to contemplate the priesthood or religious life, and your daughters to prayerfully contemplate a call to the religious life. If God is calling them, they will be happiest if they say yes. I was late in saying "yes," but so grateful that the Lord deigned to invite me to become a priest of Jesus Christ. That gift, and the grace of being the pastor here, give me great joy. Here's a reminder of what the patron of diocesan priests, St. John Vianney, in his Catechism on the *Priesthood*, says about the priesthood: Saint Bernard tells us that everything has come to us through Mary; and we may also say that everything has come to us through the priest; yes, all happiness, all graces, all heavenly gifts. If we had not the Sacrament of Orders, we should not have Our Lord. Who placed Him there, in that tabernacle? It was the priest. Who was it that received your soul, on its entrance into life? The priest. Who nourishes it, to give it strength to make its pilgrimage? The priest. *Who will prepare it to appear before God, by*

washing that soul, for the last time, in the blood of Jesus Christ? The priest -- always the priest. And if that soul comes to the point of death, who will raise it up, who will restore it to calmness and peace? Again the priest. You cannot recall one single blessing from God without finding, side by side with this recollection, the image of the priest. These beautiful words from St. John Vianney remind me of the great dignity of the priesthood, and humble me that the Lord has called me to this great honor and service to you. May we be a parish that fosters vocations to the priesthood and religious life. Come, Holy Spirit!

I would love to talk with you about the life of being a priest. "Pray the Lord of the harvest . . ."

Opportunities to Spend Time with Jesus

As Pastor, I'm grateful for the opportunities we have for daily Mass, as well as times of adoration on Wednesday and Friday evenings. In these ways, the faithful can spend quiet prayerful time with Jesus. In the quiet of the Church, we are invited to enter into His rest, as we pour out our hearts to Him and receive consolations in the Spirit. Most of us live lives of hectic busyness, and the Lord longs for us to "come away by ourselves" for prayer and rest on a regular basis. Jesus modeled this "retreating" from the busyness of the world. By following His example, we can be strengthened for the daily work of being a disciple. Spending time in prayer is never wasted time. Let's commit ourselves to praying more and more. I sense the Lord saying to me (and to you): "Don't just do something. Sit there!"
