May we see in our Blessed Mother's Assumption our own promise of resurrection and life with God. Amen!

The Gift of the Priesthood

We are in the midst of the Bread of Life discourse from John's Gospel, and it is a great grace to be a priest of Jesus Christ. Each summer, the bishop invites those men who may be interested in becoming priests to gather with him, and the seminarians from our diocese, to a BBQ at St. Francis Retreat Center/Bethany House. Whenever I think about the priesthood, this quote from St. John Vianney comes to mind. This is from his *Catechism on the Priesthood*: Saint Bernard tells us that everything has come to us through Mary; and we may also say that everything has come to us through the priest; yes, all happiness, all graces, all heavenly gifts. If we had not the Sacrament of Orders, we should not have Our Lord. Who placed Him there, in that tabernacle? It was the priest. Who was it that received your soul, on its entrance into life? The priest. Who nourishes it, to give it strength to make its pilgrimage? The priest. Who will prepare it to appear before God, by washing that soul, for the last time, in the blood of Jesus Christ? *The priest—always the priest. And if that soul comes to the* point of death, who will raise it up, who will restore it to calmness and peace? Again the priest. You cannot recall one single blessing from God without finding, side by side with this recollection, the image of the priest.

None of us priests is worthy of the call, but are graced and blessed to be a blessing. As I serve year after year, I realize how blessed I am to be a priest, and to offer the sacrament, encouragement, and words of help and healing to those who are in need of healing. Please pray for me. Be assured of my daily prayers for you.

Vocations Are a Gift from God

I'm grateful for the men and women who have heard the call from God here at the Church of the Resurrection in the past. Their call has been heard because of what God has done in their hearts in and through our parish, and most especially within families where vocations are honored and discussed. We are grateful for the continuing process of discernment that Thomas Crowley, Mason Abbott, and Charlie Gates have been part of from our parish. Thomas will be entering his second year of theology at the North American College in Rome, and Mason will begin his major seminary studies at Sacred Heart Seminary in Detroit. Charlie will enter his second year of college seminary at St. John Vianney in St. Paul, MN. I'm glad to be able to report that Joseph Crowley, Thomas's older brother, is entering formation this week with the Holy Cross Fathers in South Bend. Please pray for these four men and for all those men whom the Lord is calling to the process of discernment. The Lord loves an open heart, and I think it's valuable to remind everyone that attending seminary doesn't, of course, mean more than that one is pursuing/continuing one's discernment. For those who are ordained, the Lord's call becomes clearer over time, and is ratified interiorly and by the Church. A very low pressure opportunity is coming up for those who are curious about what it might mean to take a further step in discerning a call to the priesthood.

BBQ with Bishop Boyea and Seminarians

If you are open to come and see what a next step of discernment might entail, please consider joining me, my brother priests, and Bishop Boyea next Sunday, August 18. Beginning at 4:00 p.m. at Bethany House in DeWitt, there will be a BBQ and time for fellowship and prayer for those young men (and even those not so young) who are curious about seminary and/or feel a call from the Lord to give their lives in service to the Lord. If you are a junior in high school or older who has wondered if God might be inviting you to consider the priesthood, please call me, email me, or talk to me after Mass. And let me thank families in advance for their support of sons and brothers who discern the priesthood, and daughters and sisters who discern the religious life.
