Fruits of Holy Communion

These past few weeks (and one more after this), we have been meditating on the Bread of Life discourse, and the Church's teaching about the meaning of John 6 and our Catholic belief in the Eucharist. Here are some choice excerpts from the *Catechism of the Catholic Church* for your reflection:

1391 Holy Communion augments our union with Christ. The principal fruit of receiving the Eucharist in Holy Communion is an intimate union with Christ Jesus. Indeed, the Lord said: "He who eats my flesh and drinks my blood abides in me, and I in him." 226 Life in Christ has its foundation in the Eucharistic banquet: "As the living Father sent me, and I live because of the Father, so he who eats me will live because of me." 227 (460, 521)...

1392 What material food produces in our bodily life, Holy Communion wonderfully achieves in our spiritual life. Communion with the flesh of the risen Christ, a flesh "given life and giving life through the Holy Spirit," 229 preserves, increases, and renews the life of grace received at Baptism. This growth in Christian life needs the nourishment of Eucharistic Communion, the bread for our pilgrimage until the moment of death, when it will be given to us as viaticum.

1393 Holy Communion separates us from sin. The body of Christ we receive in Holy Communion is "given up for us," and the blood we drink "shed for the many for the forgiveness of sins." For this reason the Eucharist cannot unite us to Christ without at the same time cleansing us from past sins and preserving us from future sins: (613)

For as often as we eat this bread and drink the cup, we proclaim the death of the Lord. If we proclaim the Lord's death, we proclaim the forgiveness of sins. If, as often as his blood is poured out, it is poured for the forgiveness of sins, I should always receive it, so that it may always forgive my sins. Because I always sin, I should always have a remedy. 230 (St. Ambrose)

1394 As bodily nourishment restores lost strength, so the Eucharist strengthens our charity, which tends to be weakened in daily life; and this living charity wipes away venial sins. 231 By giving himself to us Christ revives our love and enables us to break our disordered attachments to creatures and root ourselves in him: (1863, 1436)

Since Christ died for us out of love, when we celebrate the memorial of his death at the moment of sacrifice we ask that love may be granted to us by the coming of the Holy Spirit. We humbly pray that in the strength of this love by which Christ willed to die for us, we, by receiving the gift of the Holy Spirit, may be able

to consider the world as crucified for us, and to be ourselves as crucified to the world.... Having received the gift of love, let us die to sin and live for God. 232 (St. Fulgentius of Ruspe)

The Eucharist is all about love, receiving love, living in love, and sharing love with others. Love heals and frees us from sin and death. Let us have open-hearted reception of all the fruits of Holy Communion today and every time we receive. Amen!

Renovation Progress

We will know more in the next couple of weeks how soon we will be able to return to having Mass in the church. As you may recall, the altar, the ambo, and the reredos won't be finished up until Advent, so we will not have the dedication of the new altar until that time. We will, however, move back to the church as soon as possible, which means as soon as the pews and sound system have been installed. Please keep the contractors and suppliers and artisans in your prayers as they continue to work toward the completion of the process. I am excited to be able to move back into the church, but the timeline of that is uncertain, as these things always are. Come, Holy Spirit! I continue to be grateful for the willingness of Lansing Catholic High School to allow us to use their beautiful chapel for our Sunday Masses.

Ox Roast 2024

As you may recall, because of the church renovation and our need to continue to use Mercy Hall for daily Masses and confessions, we felt the need to postpone the Ox Roast from our typical second weekend of September to the second weekend of October. The Ox Roast will be held on Friday and Saturday October 11-12. Thanks for your flexibility, and I want to thank the Ox Roast Committee for their willingness to make this change to accommodate our renovation.


Another School Year Begins!


