Jesus, the Truth

Jesus is the Truth that will lay bear the divisions in human hearts and in communities. Some will accept it, but many will reject it. May we be among those who are more concerned to "stand with Jesus" than to have peace at all costs with those we love. The tragic reality of our time is that many in our culture seem increasingly unable to think clearly, to discriminate what is true from what is false. Many people today seem more guided by feelings and emotions than what reason and revelation tells us true. The tradition, of course, tells us that we are to love the sinner, and hate the sin.

Sadly, as a culture, we have lost the ability to make that vital distinction. The goal of our lives as families, as a parish, and as a school, is be united in the Truth. But where there is truth, some will reject it. In times like ours, when reality itself is under attack by the culture, we need to be willing to suffer the pain of division for the sake of Christ and His Church.

Jeremiah's Sobering Prophecy

Those reflections remind me of prophetic words from Jeremiah. He offers a sobering analysis of the tragedy within the Church leadership, as well as a criticism of the sentimentality of our times, pretending there is peace when there is no peace. "For from the least to the greatest of them, every one is greedy for unjust gain; and from prophet to priest, every one deals falsely. They have healed the wound of my people lightly, saying, 'Peace, peace,' when there is no peace. Were they ashamed when they committed abomination? No, they were not at all ashamed; they did not know how to blush. Therefore they shall fall among those who fall; at the time that I punish them, they shall be overthrown," says the LORD.

Thus says the LORD: "Stand by the roads, and look, and ask for the ancient paths, where the good way is; and walk in it, and find rest for your souls. But they said, 'We will not walk in it.' I set watchmen over you, saying, 'Give heed to the sound of the trumpet!' But they said, 'We will not give heed.' Therefore hear, O nations, and know, O congregation, what will happen to them. Hear, O earth; behold, I am bringing evil upon this people, the fruit of their devices, because they have not given heed to my words; and as for my law, they have rejected it (Jeremiah 6:13-19).

The answer God offers through Jeremiah, which is applicable today, is that we are to walk in the ancient paths. Some will do so; others won't. Let us be among those who walk in those ancient paths, find life, and encourage, by our witness, others to do the same. With Joshua, let us say, "As for me and my household, we will serve the Lord." Amen.



Altar Society Funeral Luncheon Coordinator

The Altar Society is looking for a Funeral Lunch Coordinator(s). Interested persons can contact Cindi Currie at 517-483-3279 or curriecindi@aol.com. Here are the details:

- When a funeral is scheduled at the Church of the Resurrection, the Parish Secretary will notify the Funeral Lunch Coordinator (FLC) if the family would like a luncheon. The Secretary will provide a family contact name and phone number.
- The FLC contacts the family representative and explains that a caterer will provide the meal. The meal options are discussed, along with the cost per guest. The family rep is asked to select a meal and provide the number of guests expected. (No later than 72 hours prior to the funeral, if possible.)
- The FLC notifies the president of the Circle scheduled to provide desserts that month.
- When a menu is selected and a count given, the caterer is notified.
- The FLC contacts individuals on the Volunteer list and schedules for Table Setup, Beverage Prep, Dessert Setup, Serving Table Setup, and Cleanup.
- The FLC inventories the supplies in the Mercy Hall Altar Society Storage Cabinet and purchases any supplies needed. (Paper plates, salad bowls, dessert plates, hot/cold cups, napkins, placemats, coffee, lemon drink...)
- The day of the funeral the FLC oversees the setup/prep of the luncheon (and may perform these tasks herself),
 making sure things are ready. When the guests have arrived, the food is set out on the serving table(s) and
 replenished as needed. After the meal, the FLC ensures that the dining area and kitchen are cleaned, serving
 materials are cleaned and put away, and supplies put away.
- The Caterer invoice and payment for the meal are submitted to the Altar Society Treasurer.





