#### **Church Renovation and Mass Times Changes**

Thanks be to God, we're getting very close to being able to be back in the church. The pews should be installed this week, along with the new sound system. If all goes as planned, we will be in the church at 5:00 p.m., Saturday the 28th, then for three Masses on Sunday in the church, at 9:00 a.m., 11:00 a.m., and 5:00 p.m. As I've mentioned in previous articles and at Masses, we won't yet have the new altar, the new ambo, or the altar of repose with reredos until late November or early Advent. We will use our old ambo, tabernacle, and a wooden altar until we have Bishop Boyea come for the dedication of the altar after those things are installed. We hope to be able to schedule that before Christmas. (Stay tuned!)

#### Super Raffle at Ox Roast

In conjunction with the Ox Roast Festival, our Super Raffle Ticket will be drawn on Saturday of the Ox Roast. The top prize is \$10,000. (We won't have the old \$2 raffle this year, so the \$50 you often spent on buying the twenty-five tickets can go toward this much larger prize.) You can buy your (lower priced!) ticket for \$50 on the website. They are also available after Masses. As I like to say, buy early and buy often.

#### **Communio/Resurrection Life**

As I mentioned earlier this year, thanks to generous support of the diocese, our parish and two other parishes are partnering with Communio to promote and provide a range of events and opportunities that will help us build a parish culture that is ordered to fostering healthy relationships. We are a parish that is known for supporting families, and we want to do an even better job of doing so. As you may know, one of our core values is "Supportive of Families." We realize that we should expand that to focus on building and fostering healthy relationships, for all who are part of the parish, those married, and those who are not yet or no longer married. Over the next three years, we will be working with Communio to establish various opportunities for fellowship, fun, and formation (skills building) for members of the parish who are in various states of life. I'm grateful that Maureen Budd has agreed to take on the part-time task of working with a team of staff and members of the parish who will work together to plan and implement programs to expand our outreach in the community, sustain individuals and couples in their walk in Christ, and to provide opportunities for spiritual and practical growth in relationships. Rather than calling this "Communio," we have decided to have these events be offered as part of "Resurrection Life" or "Res Life." In a sense, everything we do should be "Res Life," since it's life in Christ. Because we want to be more intentional in building skills and reaching out to the community, watch for future offerings under the "Res Life" banner.

And please pray that we will be responsive to the felt needs and to the Lord's leading, as we go. Again, stay tuned for upcoming "Res Life" events, and please pray for Maureen and the others who will serve on the Res Life team that will help plan, organize, and recruit teams to help run the events we will hold moving forward.

#### **Prayer for the Election**

I suspect that many of you have already heard about this, but I want to invite all of you to pray this prayer of consecration. Fr. Chad Ripperger, who compiled the prayers in the book of Deliverance Prayers, wrote this prayer. He recommends praying this consecratory prayer every day until the election:

#### CONSECRATION OF THE ELECTION TO THE BLESSED VIRGIN MARY

*Mary Immaculate, living tabernacle of the Divinity,* where the eternal Wisdom lies hidden to be adored and served by angels and men, Queen of heaven and of earth, beneath whose sway are subject all things that are lower than God, Patroness of the United States of America, sorrowful and mindful of our own sinfulness and the sins of our nation, we come to thee, our refuge and hope. Knowing that our country cannot be saved by our own works and mindful of how much our nation has departed from the ways of thy Son, we humbly ask that thou wouldst turn thine eves upon our country to bring about its conversion. We consecrate to thee the integrity of the upcoming election and its outcome, so that what is spiritually and morally best for the citizens of our country may be accomplished, and that all of those who are elected would govern according to the spiritual and moral principles which will bring our nation into conformity with the teachings of thy Son. Give grace to the citizens of this land so that they will choose leaders according to the Sacred Heart of thy Son, that his glory may be made manifest, lest we be given the leaders we deserve. Trusting in the providential care of God the Father and thy maternal care, we have perfect confidence that thou wilst take care of us and will not leave us forsaken. O Mary Immaculate, pray for us. Amen.

#### 2025 GUIDELINES FOR SCHEDULING MASS INTENTIONS

#### POLICY & PROCEDURE

- Mass stipends are \$10 and are to be paid when requesting Masses. Payable by check or exact change only.
- Limit of 6 Masses per parish family may be requested for the year, (up to 2 of these can be for the Sunday obligation).
- Only 1 intention per Mass is allowed, per Canon Law. However, to better accommodate the needs of our parishioners, we can list up to <u>2</u> <u>first names with the same last name</u> (e.g. John & Mary Smith) OR <u>2 last names</u> (e.g. Jones & Smith Families)
- No Mass will be permanently affixed in the Mass Book until the stipend is received.
- The first stipend received is assigned the date.

#### SPECIAL NOTES TO REMEMBER

- Have an alternate date/time in mind.
- Please note that scheduled Masses may need to be moved to another date/time due to the availability of our priest.
