We're Back in the Church

Thanks to all of you for your patience as we have navigated these past five months of work on the church. We are back in the church this weekend, though there are, as you know, some of the aspects of the renovation and various furnishings, which are yet to be delivered and installed. Over the next months, we will be seeing more and more of it come together. In the new year, we look forward to having icons of the Archangels Gabriel and Raphael "written" and placed in the east and west niches of the sanctuary. The design is still in the process of being approved, as is the design of the new celebrant and concelebrant furnishings. We will be using old furnishings for now, as we await the approval and crafting of those pieces. Again, thanks for your patience as we anticipate having things completed.

Communion with an Altar/Communion Rail

Many of you choose to receive communion kneeling and on the tongue, and many opt to receive communion in the hand. That will not change with the installation of the altar/communion rail. As we have done with the kneelers, the best way to receive is to stand or kneel at the altar/communion rail next to those who are in the line ahead and behind you. The priest or extraordinary minister of holy communion will then move from his/her left to right, and then move back to cycle through the line again. This should be smooth, but it may require some adjustment. We'll get the hang of it, of course. Again, you are free to receive kneeling or standing, and in the hands or on the tongue.

Annual Convocation of Priests of the Diocese of Lansing

Beginning Monday afternoon, Bishop Boyea and the priests of the diocese will have their annual Priest Convocation. The dates are Monday, September 30 through Thursday, October 3. We will not have Mass here Tuesday, Wednesday, or Thursday. Local Mass times for Tuesday, Wednesday, and Thursday at St. Martha and St. John Student Parish are listed elsewhere in the bulletin. If you would, please keep Bishop Boyea, my brother priests, and me in your prayers this week. Thank you!

The One Who Gives Us Jesus

Who is the one who prepares the Holy Eucharist for us and gives Our Lord to us? It is the priest. If there were no priests, there would be no Holy Sacrifice of the Mass, nor Holy Communion, nor the Real Presence of Jesus in the tabernacle.

And who is the priest? He is the "Man of God" (2 Tim. 3:17). It is God alone who chooses him and calls him from among men for a very special task. God signs him with a sacred character that will endure forever, making him "a priest forever" and bestowing on him the supernatural powers of the ministerial priesthood so that he is consecrated exclusively for the things of God.

By his ordination the priest is consecrated in soul and body. He becomes a being totally sacred, likened to the Divine Priest, Jesus. He fills Jesus' role in the most important works of universal redemption, namely, divine worship and the spread of the Gospel.

The Holy Spirit makes the priest's soul a likeness of Jesus, empowers the priest to fill the role of Jesus so that "the priest at the altar acts in the same Person of Jesus" (St. Cyprian), and "has charge of all of God" (St. John Chrysostom). Who will be astonished, then, if the priestly dignity is declared "heavenly" (Cassian), "divine" (St. Dionysius), "infinite" (St. Ephrem), the "summit of every greatness" (St. Ignatius Martyr), something "lovingly venerated by the very angels" (St. Gregory Nazianzen), so great that "when the priest conducts the Divine Sacrifice, Angels station themselves about him and in a choir they chant a hymn of praise in honor of the Victim who is sacrificed" (St. John Chrysostom). And this happens at every Mass!
