The Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe

We come to the end of our Liturgical Year by celebrating the Reign of God manifest in Jesus Christ our Lord and King. Our entire life as Christians is ordered to hope and anticipation of Christ's return and our own fellowship with Him in Heaven. Our home is in Heaven, and the King who is to come is our Brother, our Friend. If we walk always by His side, following Him, accompanying Him in our daily choices, we have no reason to fear His return. He will welcome us into His Father's House.

Advent Begins Next Sunday

What a great transition we find at this time of year! Right after we celebrate Christ's Kingship, we begin to anticipate His coming in three ways: His Incarnation (coming as a baby for us), His coming again in glory, and His coming in our hearts. It is a holy season of anticipation. May we all enter deeply into this great season of hope. To assist you in your preparation, please take a booklet filled with meditations for each day of Advent. The *Magnificat Advent Companion*, is available at the various exits of the Church.

Living With an Eye to Eternity

Last Sunday, I quoted from C.S. Lewis's 1939 essay, "Learning in War Time." On Sunday, I also quoted from the *Resolutions of Jonathan Edwards* when he was 19 years old. I share them here for your reference and reflection:

"You would be surprised if you knew how soon one begins to feel the shortness of the tether: of how many things, even in middle life, we have to say "No time for that", "Too late now", and "Not for me". But Nature herself forbids you to share that experience. A more Christian attitude, which can be attained at any age, is that of leaving futurity in God's hands. We may as well, for God will certainly retain it whether we leave it to Him or not. Never, in peace or war, commit your virtue or your happiness to the future. Happy work is best done by the man who takes his long-term plans somewhat lightly and works from moment to moment "as to the Lord". It is only our daily bread that we are encouraged to ask for. The present is the only time in which any duty can be done or any grace received." (Lewis, C.S., "Learning in War Time")

The Resolutions of Jonathan Edwards (1722-23, when he was 19-20 years old):

Being sensible that I am unable to do anything without God's help, I do humbly entreat him by his grace to enable me to keep these Resolutions, so far as they are agreeable to his will, for Christ's sake. Remember to read over these Resolutions once a week.

1. Resolved, that I will do whatsoever I think to be most to God's glory, and my own good, profit and pleasure, in the whole of my duration, without any consideration of

the time, whether now, or never so many myriads of ages hence. Resolved to do whatever I think to be my duty and most for the good and advantage of mankind in general. Resolved to do this, whatever difficulties I meet with, how many soever, and how great soever.

3. Resolved, if ever I shall fall and grow dull, so as to neglect to keep any part of these Resolutions, to repent of all I can remember, when I come to myself again.

5. Resolved, never to lose one moment of time; but improve it the most profitable way I possibly can.

6. Resolved, to live with all my might, while I do live.

7. Resolved, never to do anything, which I should be afraid to do, if it were the last hour of my life.

17. Resolved, that I will live so, as I shall wish I had done when I come to die.

18. Resolved, to live so, at all times, as I think is best in my devout frames, and when I have clearest notions of things of the gospel, and another world.

19. Resolved, never to do any thing, which I should be afraid to do, if I expected it would not be above an hour, before I should hear the last trump.

20. Resolved, to maintain the strictest temperance, in eating and drinking.

21. Resolved, never to do any thing, which if I should see in another, I should count a just occasion to despise him for, or to think any way the more meanly of him.

I continue to pour out my heart of thanks for all God has given me by sending me to the Church of the Resurrection. My prayer for you is that you will experience the delight that our God takes in you as you pour out your thanks to Him. May your time of celebration be filled with love, joy, and peace. We will have Mass on Thanksgiving Day at 8:15 a.m. Join us if you're able. We will have the opportunity for prayer in the church on Friday, but we will not have exposition until the Holy Hour from 5:30-6:30 p.m.
