Merry Christmas!

It's still Christmas. Celebrate! Beginning with the celebration of Christmas, the Church enjoys eight days, an "Octave" of Christmas. The secular world is "done" with Christmas the day after Christmas. But for us, Christmas is just beginning! For eight days (and more) we celebrate Christ's birth. Next Sunday, we celebrate the Epiphany, and the week after that, we celebrate the Baptism of the Lord, which marks the end of the Christmas Season. It's a time of joy. So, keep on celebrating! Enjoy the goodness of God who gave us a Redeemer and a Holy Family to celebrate and emulate in our homes. May you and all those you love experience joy and peace in this holy season, and know the love of God made flesh in Baby Jesus. At the various exits, you will find copies of a book of reflections called Travel Maps: Reflections on the Resurrection Life, written by Sean O'Neill, which you can use for individual reflection or in a group context. There are also copies of Mere Christianity, by C.S. Lewis. It is a classic work of basic apologetics, and definitely worth reading (again!). We also have available the most recent copy of *Resurrection Magazine*. Please take copies and share them with others.

Solemnity of the Holy Family of Jesus, Mary, and Joseph

This Sunday, we celebrate the Holy Family. Of course, with the birth of Jesus, the Holy Family was complete. Joseph and Mary provide to all of us, but especially to parents, of what it means to "model" the faith for their family. Mary and Joseph were holy and they made their home a place of holiness. God our Father longs for all homes to be marked by holiness. Let us entrust our homes and our families to the prayers of the Holy Family, so that we might share their destiny, which is life in Heaven forever.

Mary, the Mother of God (New Years Day)

On Wednesday, which is the "Octave of Christmas," we will celebrate the Solemnity of the Blessed Virgin Mary, the Mother of God. Masses for the Holy Day are as follows: We will have one Vigil Mass at 5:00 p.m., December 31, as well as a Mass during the night at 10:30 p.m., which will be followed by adoration and Benediction just prior to Midnight. On January 1st, we will have one Mass at 10:00 a.m. It is a holy day of obligation, so find a time to attend Mass here or elsewhere. If you are traveling, may you have the protection of your guardian angels, and have a joyous celebration with your family and friends. God bless you all!

Special Event: Twelfth Night

On January 11th, we will celebrate our fourth annual Twelfth Night Celebration. Doors will open at 6:15 p.m. (after the evening Mass) and the program will begin at 6:45 p.m. It's a celebration of the great gift of Christ's manifestation at Christmas and Epiphany. Adults in the parish and friends are invited to join us for an evening of songs, music, and poetry that will inspire and entertain in equal measure. The Twelfth Night has been a traditional celebration since before medieval times, particularly in Europe, and involves the consumption of abundant food and drink as well as performances to honor the birth of our Savior. You can sign-up to join us on our website. Space is limited, so register early. I hope to see you there!

My Resurrection Magazine Article

In case you haven't picked up a copy of the Res Magazine, I'm including the bulk of my article here, as well. *Merry Christmas, everyone! Each year, we celebrate with* great pomp and circumstance the joyous arrival of our savior, Jesus Christ our Lord, who was born of the Blessed Virgin Mary, and laid in a manger, because there was no room for them at the Inn. Thankfully, we have room for Jesus in our hearts, and we know well that Jesus dwells in the tabernacle. Thanks to your generosity, this year, after long anticipation, we celebrate the Incarnation in our *newly renovated (but not yet completed) church. Thank* you all for your ongoing support of our ministries and your gifts that made possible the renovation of our church. A beautiful church is a gift to us and a worthy context within which to worship God who took on flesh for us. The church has always been beautiful, but I think that the renovation fulfills in a more powerful way the "promise" of the exterior of the church. Some would say that the old sanctuary looked like a stage, and many wondered if the church had originally been the gym. Of course, that wasn't the case. But now, it seems to me, and to many of you, I trust, that we are invited into the heavenly liturgy more clearly. The grandeur of the pillars and the coffered ceiling that serves as a window to the heavens, and the presence to our vision of the icons of saints of the Resurrection, the beautiful crucifix and the grieving icons of our Mother Mary and John the Beloved Disciple, all of that, and the repainted statues of the saints, transport us into the heavenly court. The beauty of the church confirms for us the mystery of redemption made possible because God the Son chose to come among us as a little, helpless baby. Each time we celebrate the Mass, heaven comes to earth and we are caught up to heaven. The poignancy of this mystery is made manifest especially at Christmas . . . Jesus, God!, came, thanks to Mary's yes, among us. He was laid in a manger and served early and throughout his life as a sign of contradiction, of love of enemies, and peace to all. May we emulate His love, and Mary's too, this Christmas.




