"Ordinary Time"

Today, we celebrate the 2nd Sunday in Ordinary Time. There is nothing "ordinary" or "plain" about "ordinary time." The name stems from the word ordinal, meaning "numbered." The Latin for this liturgical period, which makes up the majority of our Liturgical Year, is Tempus Per Annum, which means "time throughout the year." We do have special seasons during the year, but every Sunday of Ordinary Time is a day of obligation. We have an extraordinary opportunity to experience God's redemptive love for us whenever we gather together as a community of faith at Mass. Each and every time we celebrate the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass, we recall Christ's Incarnation, His Death, His Resurrection, His Ascension, and the outpouring of the Holy Spirit upon us for the forgiveness of sins. So, because the time we spend at Mass is anything but ordinary (after all, the Sacrifice of Christ on Calvary is made present, and Heaven comes to earth!), it is essential that we come each week (or even more often) to celebrate the Mass, to remember how extraordinary our life is in Christ. I'm very grateful for the renovation of our church, and the dedication that will happen soon, which allow us to enter into the heavenly realm more easily, given the lamb on the altar and the saints in the reredos. I hope and pray that the church will help all of us and any who visit get a glimpse of the heaven we long to inherit.


Baby Shower Today! Sponsored by the Altar Society
