Dedication of the Altar

Yesterday (Saturday, January 25), Bishop Boyea dedicated our altar. In the Worship Aid, I wrote the following. I offer it to you for your reflection, as we enjoy the beauty of our renovated church: It is with joy that we celebrate the glorious liturgy the Church gives us for the dedication of an altar. This is all possible because of God's goodness and your generous prayers and support. Thank you.

As pastor, I am grateful to you and to the Lord for the gift of this renovation, and want to thank the architects, craftsmen, and laborers. Most especially, I want to thank Chris Spalding, who, like his father a generation ago, served as general contractor for the project. The Church of the Resurrection has been generations in the making, and we are recipients of the faith and witness of those who have gone before us. Thanks be to God.

A beautiful church is a gift to the people and a worthy context within which to worship the Lord in spirit and truth. The changes we have made help align the interior of the church with the promise made by its gothic exterior. The pillars give prominence to the sanctuary; the coffered ceiling serves as a window to the heavens; the octagonal ambo (and baptistry) remind us that we gather on the Lord's Day every eight days; the altar with its Alpha and Omega and the central Lamb invite us into the Heavenly Liturgy described in Revelation 5, even as the cubic surround of the altar points to the promised New Jerusalem in Revelation 21. The icons of the "Saints of the Resurrection," St. Mary Magdalen, St. Paul, St. Peter, and St. Thomas, along with the icons of our grieving Mother Mary, and John the Beloved Disciple, draw us deep into the paschal mystery and the heavenly liturgy.

The Roman Canon, after the consecration, conveys our heart's desire and plaintive cry:

In humble prayer we ask you, almighty God:
command that these gifts be borne by the hands of your holy Angel to your altar on high in the sight of your divine majesty, so that all of us, who through this participation at the altar receive the most holy Body and Blood of your Son, may be filled with every grace and heavenly blessing.

That's our prayer. That's our hope in this Jubilee Year of Hope. May it be the case that each of us, each time we attend Mass or pray in this church, are filled with every grace and heavenly blessing. Amen.

Prayers for the Nation

After the inauguration of the president on January 20, it is well for us to pray for newly elected officers and politicians and leaders at the federal, state, and local levels. As Christians, we also do well to pray for respect of human life and dignity and a healing of divisions. May we as Catholic Christians continue to pray and speak to political leaders to encourage them to promote the true common good and to uphold freedoms given us by God, especially the right to life and freedom of religion.




