ANOINTING OF THE SICK/ MINISTRY TO THE SICK

The Church strongly encourages people to receive the Sacrament (Anointing) of the Sick at the early stages of serious sickness or before serious surgeries.

In emergency situations needing the prompt attention of a priest, please call the parish office.

MARRIAGE

Archdiocesan law requires advance notice of at least six months.

PARISH REGISTRATION

Newcomers to the parish may register in the Parish Office during regular office hours. Others, please notify the Parish Office of address changes.

Adults over 21 need to be registered as an individual member to be considered a Catholic in Good Standing.

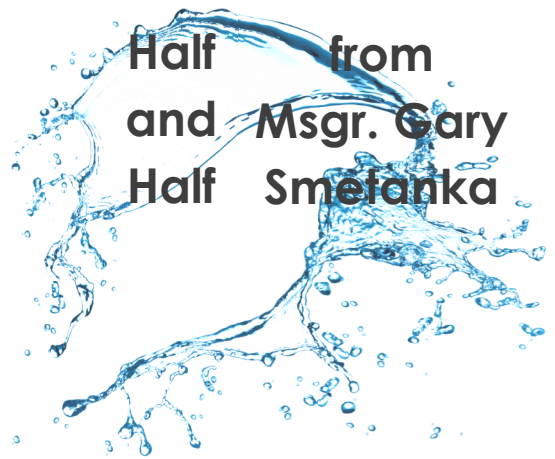
Hearing devices are available for use during Mass. Please ask an usher for assistance.

** Please join us Monday night for our Holy Hour at 7:30 pm. A good time to pause and reflect on the Glory of the Christmas season.

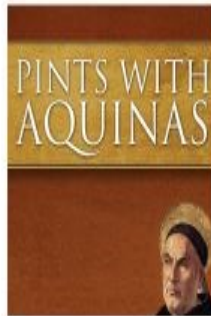
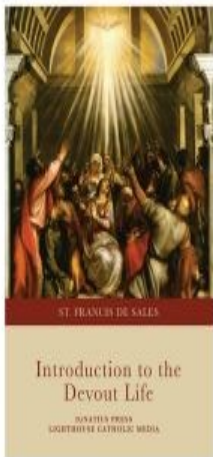
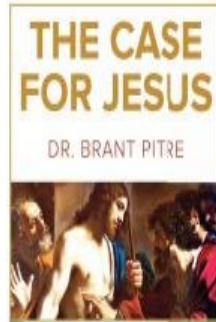

Rite of Christian Initiation

The Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA) is a process developed by the Catholic Church for prospective converts to Catholicism who are above the age of infant baptism. On Sunday, December 8th, Andi & Melissa Hamolli, Scott Turnbull and Jonathan & Adrianna Lulgjuraj participated in the Rite of Welcome and Acceptance as another step in their journey of faith to become fully initiated into the Catholic Church. We would like to introduce them to you and ask you to welcome them and continue prayers as they travel this path.

Andi and Melissa Hamolli were married in 2009 and are parents of twins, Parker and Isabella, age 7. The family moved into Grosse Pointe Woods in 2017, from St. Clair Shores, and both children attend Monteith Elementary School. 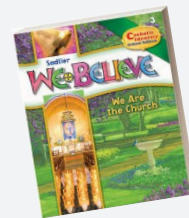

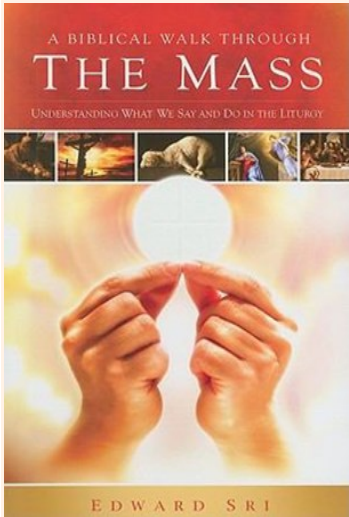

Happy New Year! It's that time when there is a lot of talk about resolutions.

Newspaper articles, TV talk shows, advertising, and other media all have suggestions for us.

For this column, I looked to Pope Francis for thoughts to present. Although the following list of ten items wasn't delivered as such, a newspaper columnist observed that it sounded like a good list to consider for New Year's Resolutions.

It was actually part of an address made a few years ago by Pope Francis to employees of the Holy See and Vatican City State and their families at a Christmas-time gathering.

This is what he asked them to do:

Take care of your spiritual life, your relationship with God, because this is the backbone of everything we do and everything we are.

Take care of your family life, giving your children and loved ones not just money, but most of all your time, attention and love.

Take care of your relationships with others, transforming your faith into life and your words into good works, especially on behalf of the needy.

Be careful how you speak, purify your tongue of offensive words, vulgarity and worldly decadence.

Heal wounds of the heart with the oil of forgiveness, forgiving those who have hurt us and medicating the wounds we have caused others.

Look after your work, doing it with enthusiasm, humility, competence, passion and with a spirit that knows how to thank the Lord.

Be careful of envy, lust, hatred and negative feelings that devour our interior peace and transform us into destroyed and destructive people.

Watch out for anger that can lead to vengeance; for laziness that leads to existential euthanasia; for pointing the finger at others, which leads to pride; and for complaining continually, which leads to desperation.

Take care of brothers and sisters who are weaker... the elderly, the sick, the hungry, the homeless and strangers, because we will be judged on this.

A great list to consider now and any time during the year.

Why Do Catholics Do That?

Catholics have been around a LONG time, so they've had a lot of years to think about things... to develop habits and practices and to come up with certain ways of doing things. And unlike Protestant churches, which split and break pretty regularly, Catholic Churches don't really. Many of the practices that made sense to the Old Testament Jews, the first century Christians, people today, and everyone in between—Well, they're still around today.

So if you've ever wondered "Why do Catholics do all the weird things they do" — you're not alone. Many lifelong Catholics don't know either. Here is one explanation of why we Catholics do what we do.

Why Do Catholics Pray to Mary and the Saints?

Have you ever asked a friend or family member to pray for you? Or asked them to help you out with something you were struggling with spiritually? Catholics do the same thing when they pray to Mary or a Saint. While Protestants typically believe Mary and the Saints aren't in Heaven yet or are in Heaven but just can't hear us down here on Earth, Catholics believe Mary and some saints are already in Heaven and can hear us. Catholics still pray to God and Jesus — same as Protestants do. And they still ask their friends and family to pray for them when they are struggling — same as Protestants do. They simply ask Christians who have gone before to pray for them too.
