The Church strongly encourages people to receive the Sacrament (Anointing) of the Sick at the early stages of serious sickness or before serious surgeries.

In emergency situations needing the prompt attention of a priest, please call the parish office.

MARRIAGE

Archdiocesan law requires advance notice of at least six months.

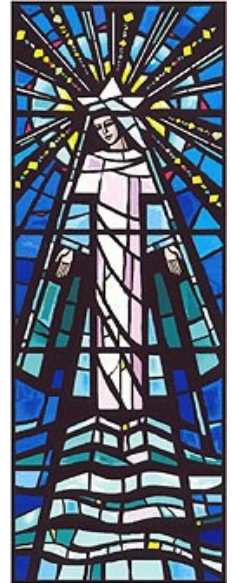
Consecration to Mary Ceremony

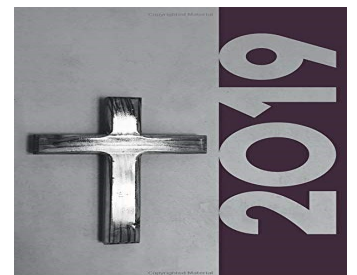

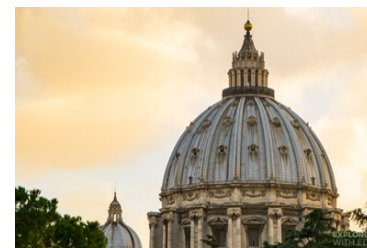

The account of the Magi finding Jesus is well known, but what message does it have for us on this feast of the Epiphany of the Lord?

These days, we may hear someone say they had an epiphany moment. They are referring to a sudden realization about the nature or meaning of something. It can occur based on an experience that brings about some type of sudden realization.

For the Magi, Pope Benedict XVI described it this way: "The Magi worshipped a simple Child in the arms of his Mother Mary, because in him they recognized the source of the twofold light that had guided them: the light of the star and the light of the Scriptures. In him they recognized the King of the Jews, the glory of Israel, but also the King of all the peoples."

So, with the "light of the star and the light of the Scriptures", they found the Light of the world.

Christ is the light that is for all people and for all generations. He is that light through the Church and its members today.

"The mystery of the Church and her missionary dimension are also revealed in the liturgical context of the Epiphany. She is called to make Christ's light shine in the world, reflecting it in herself as the moon reflects the light of the sun." (Pope Benedict XVI)

When we share that light, we are evangelizing.

How will you share the light of Christ this week? Will you welcome a stranger in church, call a person who may be lonely, offer to volunteer when you would rather stay home, or contact someone who is going through a difficult time?

How will we as a parish share that light this year?

Whatever we as individuals or as a parish may do, we know that we have the Holy Spirit to inspire and guide us.

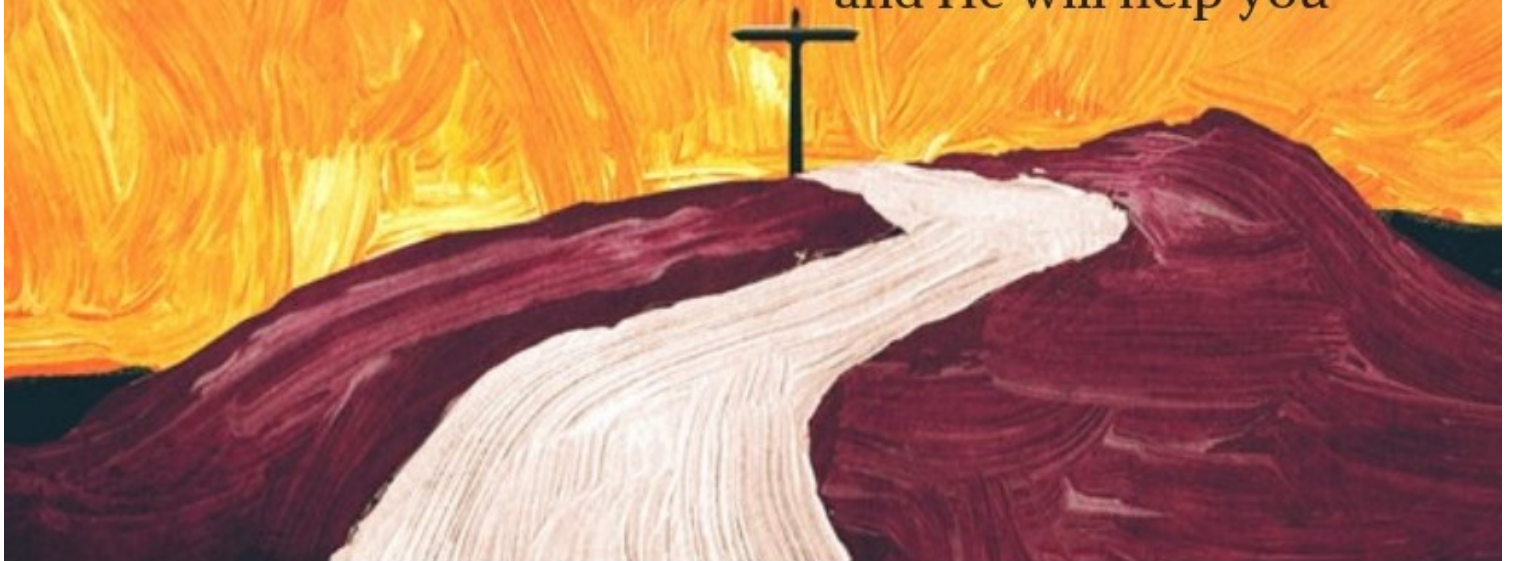
