Please call the parish office during the last months of pregnancy to arrange for Baptism classes and schedule the Sacrament. Everyone has a right to their own sacramental certificate. No one has the right to another person's certificate, except: the parent/guardian of a minor child. (Archdiocese of Detroit)

ANOINTING OF THE SICK/ MINISTRY TO THE SICK

The Church strongly encourages people to receive the Sacrament (Anointing) of the Sick at the early stages of serious sickness or before serious surgeries.

In emergency situations needing the prompt attention of a priest, please call the parish office.

MARRIAGE

Archdiocesan law requires advance notice of at least six months.

PARISH REGISTRATION

Newcomers to the parish may register in the Parish Office during regular office hours. Others, please notify the Parish Office of address changes. Adults over 21 need to be registered as an individual member to be considered a Catholic in Good Standing.

Hearing devices are available for use during Mass. Please ask an usher for assistance.



As we celebrate the baptism of the Lord, we once again recognize that our faith is rooted in our own "baptism in the Lord." This should be the core from which everything we are, do and say emanates. We have died with Christ in the waters of baptism and have been called to take on his life of service and love in all that we do. Do we??

We are all called to a vocation in life. For some it is being married. For others it is being single. For still others it is through "religious life." No matter our vocation call, we will are called to live that vocation out through our baptism. Do we??? Or do we somehow think or believe that all this religion is only to be lived out by the professional "religious" people?

As I often explain at baptisms, everything goes back to our baptism and our place of baptism. Everything that we are called to be, by God, goes back to our incorporation into the family of God through our baptism, becoming his daughter or son. Everything we do as christians flows from our baptism as we are called to be the Light of Christ to others and take on the image of Jesus and His dying and rising in our life. Many people also do not realize that, for Catholics, all of our significant religious events are recorded at our place of baptism. Each parish has a big book to record every baptism. Each person has their own line that includes the names of the parents and Godparents, date and city of birth and date of baptism, the person baptizing, and then also the dates of First Communion, Confirmation as well as the sacraments of Matrimony and Holy Orders also get noted. Parishes are required to inform the church of baptism for all those sacraments a person receives. [Often people are asked to provide a newly issued baptismal certificate, e.g., before marriage in the Church, not one in the safety deposit box.] This process helps to ensure the accuracy of statements of sacramental reception. It is a standard procedure but when you are asked to do such, please do so more than a few hours before you need it!

Just a word of clarification about the role of Godparents. Often people think of them as those who will assume the legal responsibility of the child if something happens to the parents. That is NOT the role of Godparents. Godparents, one male and one female by Canon Law, help the parents in providing the formation of the Catholic faith of the person being baptized. That is something that should be taken seriously and not just picking the next person in the family line. Hence, logically, you cannot pick a Jewish friend or a non-Catholic as "Godparents." When it comes to the Sacrament of Baptism, a person must have at least one person who is Catholic that will assume the role of a Godparent. (A person cannot have more than two Godparents. If, for some reason parents insist that there has to be more than two, only two will be recorded in the Baptismal Register.) A Godparent must be at least 16 years of age and fully initiated into the Catholic Church. A person who is a non-Catholic Christian would be recorded as a "Christian witness." (For more information go to our website under the Sacrament of Baptism.)

During the celebration of baptism, the Godparents themselves are asked three times if they are willing and able to assume the responsibilities of raising the child in the Catholic faith. Hence, it is an important lifetime responsibility regarding the faith!

This week let us reflect on the importance of our own baptism. If we do not know our baptismal date, maybe we can find out the date. Think of the significance of that baptism in your life as a christian or disciple of Jesus. How is your life lived out so that others know, without a doubt, that you are a baptized christian or Catholic?

** As we bring to a close the Christmas season, let us continue to hold each other in



Stewardship Thoughts

As is fitting, today's Scripture passages are linked by the common theme of "water." Isaiah, near the end of the Babylonian exile, prophesies, through the Lord, All you who are thirsty, come to the water! St. John proclaims in his First Letter, This is the one who came through water and blood, Jesus Christ, not by water alone, but by water and blood. In St. Mark's Gospel, the evangelist quotes John the Baptist in reference to Jesus before our Lord's Baptism in the Jordan River, I have baptized you with water; he [Jesus] will baptize you with the Holy Spirit. The Sacrament of Baptism is the "the gateway" to all the other Sacraments. This tremendous gift of Baptism forgives sin and it is here that Christ invites us, individually, to be His disciples. When Jesus knocks on the door of our hearts daily, are we willing to let Him in, to follow Him, and through the power of the Holy Spirit, profess His Truth to a world that needs Jesus? 
