ANOINTING OF THE SICK/ MINISTRY TO THE SICK

The Church strongly encourages people to receive the Sacrament (Anointing) of the Sick at the early stages of serious sickness or before serious surgeries.

In emergency situations needing the prompt attention of a priest, please call the parish office.

MARRIAGE

Archdiocesan law requires advance notice of at least six months.

As we celebrate the baptism of the Lord, we once again recognize that our faith is rooted in our own "baptism in the Lord." This should be the core from which everything we are, do and say emanates. We have died with Christ in the waters of baptism and have been called to take on his life of service and love in all that we do. Do we??

We are all called to a vocation in life. For some it is being married. For others it is being single. For still others it is through "religious life." No matter our vocation call, we are called to live that vocation out through our baptism. Do we??? Or do we somehow think or believe that all this religion is only to be lived out by the professional "religious" people?

As I often explain at baptisms, everything goes back to our baptism and our place of baptism. Everything that we are called to be, by God, goes back to our incorporation into the family of God through our baptism, becoming his daughter or son. Everything we do as Christians flows from our baptism as we are called to be the Light of Christ to others and take on the image of Jesus and His dying and rising in our life. Many people also do not realize that, for Catholics, all of our significant religious events are recorded at our place of baptism. Each parish has a big book to record every baptism. Each person has their own line



that includes the names of the parents and Godparents, date and city of birth and date of baptism, the person baptizing, and then also the dates of First Communion, Confirmation as well as the sacraments of Matrimony and Holy Orders also get noted. Parishes are required to inform the church of baptism for all those sacraments a person receives. [Often people are asked to provide a newly issued baptismal certificate, e.g, before marriage in the Church, not one in the safety deposit box. This process helps to ensure the accuracy of statements of sacramental reception. It is a standard procedure but when you are asked to do such, please do it more than a few hours or a day before you need it!

Just a word of clarification about the role of Godparents. Often people think of them as those who will assume the legal

responsibility of the child something happens to the parents. That is NOT the role of Godparents. Godparents help the parents in providing the formation of the Catholic faith of the person being baptized. That is something that should be taken seriously and not just picking the next person in the family line. Hence, logically, you can not pick a Jewish friend or a non-Catholic as "Godparents." When it comes to the Sacrament of Baptism, a person must have at least one person who is Catholic that will assume the role of a Godparent. A person who is a non-Catholic Christian would be recorded as a "Christian witness." During the celebration of baptism, Godparents themselves are asked

three times if they are willing and able to assume the responsibilities of raising the child in the Catholic faith. So it is an important lifetime responsibility regarding the faith.

This week let us reflect on the importance of our own baptism. If we do not know our baptismal date, maybe we can find out the date. Think of the significance of that baptism in your life as a Christian or disciple of Jesus. How is your life lived out so that others know, without a doubt, that you are a baptized Christian or Catholic?



Do you know the date of your Baptism?

In one of his papal audiences, Pope Francis spoke of the importance of knowing our own Baptismal date. He asked those present to try to find out their date if they didn't already know

He called it a "blessed day" and a "feast day" saying that it was the day we were "immersed in that current of Jesus' salvation".

Jesus participated in John's baptism of repentance by being baptized Himself even though there was no need for Him to do so.

In his book, Jesus of Nazareth, Pope Benedict XVI discussed the significance of the Baptism of Jesus:

"Jesus loaded the burden of all mankind's quilt upon his shoulders; he bore it down into the depths of the Jordan. He inaugurated his public activity by stepping into the place of sinners. His inaugural gesture is an anticipation of the Cross."

As we think about our own Baptism, we thank God for our gift of faith. Going deeper, we ask how our Baptism has and continues to shape our life in these times.


As we know, "in the last half century, even as the western world has become increasingly secularized and countless people have abandoned the faith into which they were baptized, the Church has been ringing out a call for all Catholics to awaken to their baptismal identity as missionary disciples. All are being summoned to engage in a new evangelization—a renewed proclamation of the good news of Christ to the people of our time." (Unleash the Gospel)

And from Pope St. John Paul II, "There is so much need today for mature Christian personalities, conscious of their baptismal identity, of their vocation and mission in the world!"




