The Church strongly encourages people to receive the Sacrament (Anointing) of the Sick at the early stages of serious sickness or before serious surgeries.

In emergency situations needing the prompt attention of a priest, please call the parish office.

MARRIAGE

Archdiocesan law requires advance notice of at least six months.

Newcomers to the parish may register in the Parish Office during regular office hours. Others, please notify the Parish Office of address changes.

Hearing devices are available for use during Mass. Please ask an usher for assistance.

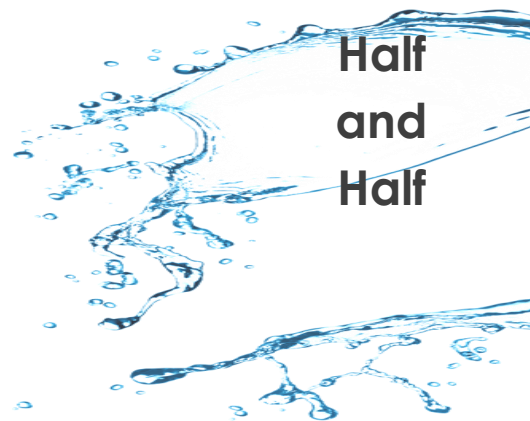

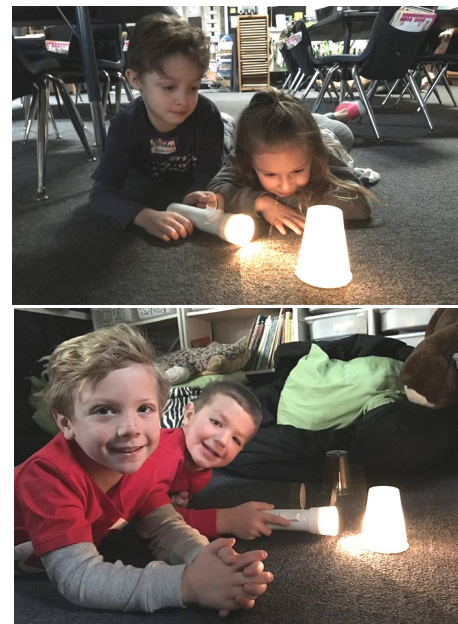
In science, we have been busy learning about light. We had so much fun experimenting with flashlights and seeing what types of objects light can travel through.

** Just a reminder about the Sacrament of the Sick, or anointing of the sick. While often referred to as the "last rites," it is not meant to be in all cases the last rites a sick or dying person receives. I know that was the understanding 50 years ago but not now. A person is invited to receive the sacrament of the sick at the start of a serious illness and as the stages might progress along the way. So a person can be anointed many times in their life. When people wait to call for a priest when one might think a person has 60 or 30 minutes left in life, one might not be able to get a priest to do the anointing. (Deacons can not anoint the sick.) It is a very comforting sacrament as we ask the Holy Spirit for strength during sickness.

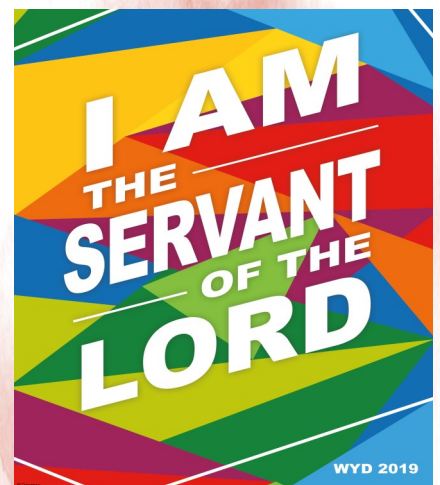

Today begins Catholic Schools Week, themed this year, "Catholic Schools: Learn. Serve. Lead. Succeed."

Did you know that the history of Catholic schools in the United States is actually older than the United States itself?

Missionaries and priests accompanied Spanish and French explorers on their travels to the continent as early as the mid-16th century.

Catholic education in America already had a strong foothold in North America by the time the first official Catholic school entered the scene in 1606, founded by the Franciscan order in present-day St. Augustine, Florida.

After the revolution Catholic education really began to grow.

Catholic schools would be established as an answer to the Protestant education that then dominated the nation's public schools. The First Plenary Council of Baltimore in 1852 specifically urged every Catholic parish in the country to establish its own school for just that reason.

Catholic schools' growth between 1900 and the mid 1960s was explosive. From an estimated 3,500 Catholic schools in the United States reaching all age groups in 1900 enrollment grew to 5.5 million elementary school and high school

students enrolled in Catholic schools. Although enrollment has declined from its peak in the 1960s, Catholic schools in the United States continue to be a dominant part of the education system. Studies of the benefits of a Catholic education show that students who attend Catholic school receive a rigorous, challenging, high-quality academic experience with an emphasis on Catholic values.

Our Star community is blessed to have an excellent school fostering Catholic values and a fine education. The fact is that the entire parish, the whole diocese and the universal Church benefit from Catholic schools and the communities we live in are strengthened.

Reading the results of studies is fine but "seeing is believing" as they say. See for yourself. Check out our excellent school today. Open House is from 12-3.

As a Catholic community we need to be proud of our schools and make sure that the Catholic school system survives whether we have children in the school or not.
