** Just a reminder about the Sacrament of the Sick, or anointing of the sick. While often referred to as the "last rites," it is not meant to be in all cases the last rites a sick or dying person receives. I know that was the understanding 50 years ago but not now. A person is invited to receive the sacrament of the sick at the start of a serious illness and as the stages might progress along the way. So a person can be anointed many times in their life. When people wait to call for a priest when one might think a person has 60 or 30 minutes left in life, one might not be able to get a priest to do the anointing. (Deacons can not anoint the sick.) It is a very comforting sacrament as we ask the Holy Spirit for strength during sickness.

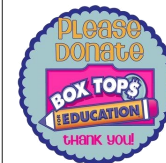

Perhaps you have seen this story about an encounter in a supermarket and were moved by it, just as I was.

A four-year old girl was sitting in a shopping cart being pushed by her mother. She saw an elderly man coming down the aisle by himself.

The little girl said to him, "Hello old person." His response was, "Well, hi little lady! How are you today?"

The three had a pleasant chat and then went on their way. While still in the store, the little girl asked her mother to take a picture of her with her new friend.

They found the man and during the course of asking him about having the photo taken, the little girl said she wanted it because it was her birthday.

He was kind of shocked at the request and a little bit delighted, too. He agreed and the mother took the picture. She then asked her daughter to thank him. When she did, he said, "No, thank you! You've made me the happiest I've been in a long time."

Later, the mother kept thinking about the man and posted the photo and a description of the encounter on Facebook. She heard from someone who knew the

man and said that he had been in a deep depression since the loss of his wife.

The mother asked for his contact information. Since then, she and her daughter have been visiting the man regularly.

As a result, he is a changed person!

About making a difference in someone's day or life, she says. "It doesn't take much — it could be as simple as helping someone reach something on a top shelf at the grocery store or just saying hello while you're standing in line."

As this story shows, it's not just through the big things that we can make a difference.

We all want to encounter Jesus. One of the ways to do that is through our encounters with others. It is seeing Him in the people we encounter and showing them His love and mercy.

This is a dimension of our outreach and good works to always keep in mind.

Cost/ Player: \$135.00
(**Only refundable** if there is no team or if a player gets cut from a team during tryouts)

Season runs:
March 12 – May 16

Please register prior to January 31st to assist us with determining the proper number of teams to register with CYO.

The spring season rules allow participation in the same sport in any other organized leagues **with the exception** of playing on a Junior High School, Middle School or Elementary School team with the following stipulations:

- Teams are allowed one (1) league game change during the regular season that is not due to a Parish/School function or that does not constitute an emergency (i.e. weather, building conditions, school closing, etc.)
- The CYO Athletic Department will not reschedule any play-off or championship games without a signed letter from the Pastor/Principal that the participating team(s) has a Parish/School function.

For track – register on St Paul Parish/School website.

Sports physical exam is required each year to be eligible to participate in CYO The physical must be **dated by the doctor after April 15, 2017.**

No student will be allowed to try out for any sport without having a sports physical on file with the Athletic Department. There are no exceptions to this requirement.
