

No one has the right to another person's certificate, except: the parent/guardian of a minor child. (Archdiocese of Detroit)

ANOINTING OF THE SICK/ MINISTRY TO THE SICK

The Church strongly encourages people to receive the Sacrament (Anointing) of the Sick at the early stages of serious sickness or before serious surgeries.

In emergency situations needing the prompt attention of a priest, please call the parish office.

MARRIAGE

Archdiocesan law requires advance notice of at least six months.

PARISH REGISTRATION

Newcomers to the parish may register in the Parish Office during regular office hours. Others, please notify the Parish Office of address changes. **Adults over 21** need to be registered as an individual member to be considered a Catholic in Good Standing.

Hearing devices are available for use during Mass. Please ask an usher for assistance.

Half and Half



This week is Catholic Schools Week. It is a time to highlight the many good things that comprise a Catholic school. The first thing that might come to mind for people is the tradition of discipline. That discipline might be in terms of a stronger code of conduct or academic rigor. Another aspect of Catholic school has been the use of uniforms. (In my earlier days I have some *vague* memories

of the girls wearing a beanie.) In addition to all of that, there is certainly the infusion of the Catholic faith. What is taught in religion class is brought to life in many ways through the other classes and activities. It is also wonderful how the children so often have a way of bringing their religion or faith to the rest of the family. This is often done through the various service "projects" of the school children and by sharing what they learn in religion class. It is great to see the children and the parents grow in the faith together!

I have so many great memories of my 22 years of Catholic education, especially grade school. I enjoyed walking back and forth to school every day with my friends. For me it was two round trips a day since we all walked home for lunch every day. I knew many of my teachers were tough but the challenge was good. Some of my teachers were lots of fun. Overall I was well prepared to be a good thinker in all situations, not simply being prepared for high school. As in any catholic school, everyone had to pitch in to make it great. I think I was in 6th grade when we did our part to let the voters of Michigan know we needed "'proposal C" so that some tax dollars might help in the education of the children. Unfortunately, after its defeat, the financial picture of catholic schools only grew more dire. Consequently that is when so many of the schools started to close. It has always been a struggle since then to "compete." Nonetheless, it has always been through the partnership of many people, i.e., parents, teachers, staff, and, in the case of "parish schools," the parishioners, that a Catholic school forms a terrific community which is its ultimate strength. It is a community of caring, giving people who bring the Good News to others in word and deeds. I am so thankful that here at Star, as in so many other parish schools, people find this as a primary reason to be in a Catholic school.

I would not give up my years of Catholic school education for anything. I might not have had all the bells and whistles along the way but I knew I was in a caring community that was preparing me for the future with a solid foundation.

We do have a school of excellence that is evaluated annually for such a distinction. While some schools can hoist a banner acknowledging a mark of distinction for one year, our distinction is EVERY year! For that I am very grateful for all who help to make Star of the Sea School this school of distinction!

** Looking ahead...as with most things during this pandemic, the distribution of ashes on Ash Wednesday will be slightly different this year. 

Please pray for our young people in Faith Formation!


