Bulletin articles are due by 10:00 a.m. on Friday. Submitted bulletin content is subject for approval. The impact of the Archdiocesan Synod '16 is still very strong as it led to Archbishop Vigneron's pastoral letter, Unleash the Gospel, and the action steps identified within. It was clear that the Holy Spirit lead the members of Synod '16 that Catholic schools are an apostolate that is the responsibility of all the parishes and the Church at large and that any Catholic family in the Archdiocese that seeks an excellent Catholic education for their family can have one. These foundational principles set the tone as schools move toward the future.

Archbishop Vigneron is calling school leadership to develop realistic, measurable strategic plans which challenge parish-based Catholic K-8 and K-12 school in the AoD to improve and grow. A strategic plan can articulate to a community what the school might look like going forward. A strategic plan also helps the school demonstrate quality (with an outstanding product, as measured by Mission and Catholic Identity, and academic excellence), and sound business management (with outstanding governance and leadership and operational vitality).

The strategic plans developed by each school are guided very heavily by Unleash the Gospel and all based upon the same standards and process as provided by the AoD. Ultimately the plan leads to the school's vision and mission statements (for review or revision), determine focus areas, establish appropriate goals, define objectives and develop action steps.

The Strategic Planning Committee is to have a few faculty members, school parents, parishioners, alumni and a member or two from a neighboring parish that does not have a school. Our committee is comprised of Mrs. Robbie

Here is what you have to do. Go to www.olsos.formed.org. If you are new to the site, simply set up your own "account" with your own login information and that's it! (If you already have an account, simply login.) You no longer have to enter a parish code because we have taken care of that for you. Once you are on the OLSOS Formed page, you will also see other items of interest that I have posted for you to enjoy. Why not check it out this week? It will only take a few minutes to set up and then you are good to go. I think you will be amazed with everything that is at your disposal...for free, provided to you by your parish!

Many thanks to all of our volunteers who share their faith with our students every week!!



This week Ash Wednesday will usher in the Lenten season, which is a season of fasting, self-denial, spiritual growth, conversion, and simplicity.

When many think of Lent, they think of crosses of ashes on foreheads, stations of the cross and no meat on Friday which means fish fries.

It can be so much more.

Lent, which comes from the Teutonic word for springtime, can be viewed as a spiritual spring cleaning: a time for taking spiritual inventory

Planned parish spiritual offerings during Lent give us an opportunity to experience that spiritual growth and conversion.

So busy that you are meeting yourself coming and going? Don't know if you can get to any planned programs but still



want to encounter Jesus in a special way this Lent?

There are tons of ways that you can enrich and enhance your spiritual life and experience conversion and growth. Here are a few suggestions. You will know what works best for you.

Download apps that are prayers, reflections, podcasts,

scripture readings, books, or just beautiful, inspiring music and listen in the car, exercising, etc.

• Explore FORMED. Sign up if haven't already done so.

• Visit the prayer chapel and take a minute to reconnect with Our Lord in a special way.




