MARRIAGE

Archdiocesan law requires advance notice of at least six months.

Newcomers to the parish may register in the Parish Office during regular office hours. Others, please notify the Parish Office of address changes. Adults over 21 need to be registered as an individual member to be considered a Catholic in Good Standing.


Another resulting proposition from the Synod centered on Parish Culture, i.e., "to build a culture of life-changing personal encounter with Jesu that permeates every aspect of parish life and that leads to a loving encounter with our neighbor." Here at Star of the Sea, in our Missionary Strategic Plan, we aim to accomplish this with three goals in mind.

Our first goal will be to create an environment which welcomes new members to our parish family. We hope to accomplish this through a team of "parish ambassadors" greeting the new families, to publicly recognize new parishioners as well as to reach out to those member of the parish who appear "missing in action."

Our second goal is to offer more opportunities to encounter Jesus! Over the next few years we aim to offer various retreats for many stages of life, evening reflections for more specific groups, e.g, the grieving, and various encounters through Holy Hours, prayer services, parish mission, praise and worship, and concerts. Through these various efforts many people will have the opportunity to encounter Jesus that is pertinent and appealing to them.

Our third goal is to offer opportunities for people to share more of their personal testimony. This might be through personal stories of encounters with Blessed Solanus Casey, conversions in and through the RCIA process, and other personal life-changing encounters.

** The season of Lent is around the corner! Ash Wednesday is Feb. 26. Speaking of building a culture of life changing events, Lent is time that is naturally filled with them. Through the many and varied



services, opportunities for the sacrament of reconciliation of confession, performing acts of service or mercy for others, delving more into some books or videos for formation and reflection, there are so many ways at our disposal for an encounter with Jesus! Many of these encounters might be "soft" but nonetheless impactful. Keep in mind we will have a special Lenten reflection by Fr. Mario Amore, one of our "weekend priests," on Monday, March 30.

During a recent RCIA (Rite of Christian Initiation) session, we were discussing the Ten Commandments. Joe Paprocki, the author of

A Well-Built Faith*,


describes the commandments as "God's Law of Love." He goes on to say that there is no mysterious secret to happiness—God has revealed it to us in these commandments. These commandments are not just a list of rules to follow but are the principles that spell out how we live in relationship with God, who alone can offer us the gift of eternal life.

But, wait a minute! Laws are restrictive, keeping us from having any fun, right? Mr. Paprocki gives a wonderful analogy . . .

"Let's say I want to be free to enjoy a good game of tennis. However, I am trapped (enslaved) by my ability to swing the racket properly. If I get coaching from a tennis pro, he or she will teach me the rules of a good tennis swing. If I follow these rules, I will be free to truly enjoy the game of tennis. In the same way, the Ten Commandments free us from enslavement to that which separates us from truly loving God and others." Ponder that for a moment. Just as you taught your children to stay away from a hot stove, God wants to keep

His children safe and teach them the best way to live. Take another look at the Ten Commandments from the perspective of a gift and see how you can open and enjoy them each and every day.



go and make disciples

Because Lent is just around the corner, last week we discussed performing the works of mercy during Lent. It is not too soon to think about what we can do to grow spiritually during this season of fasting, self-denial, spiritual growth, conversion, and simplicity.

In today's column another suggestion for a Lenten practice is offered.

Lenten programs and plans can be a time-out, an opportunity to examine our relationship with God and those around us and a chance for spiritual growth and conversion; a spiritual spring cleaning.

So busy that you are meeting yourself coming and going? Don't know if you can get to any planned programs but still want to encounter Jesus in a special way this Lent?

There are tons of ways that you can enrich and enhance your spiritual life and experience conversion and growth. You will know what works best for you.

Here's something to think about.

We have heard the parable about the rich man who asks Jesus what he should do to follow Him. After answering that he obeys the commandments, etc. Jesus tells him to sell all he has to be able to follow him. Letting go this Lent may be the right road to follow.

"Some of us may need to let go of money to follow Jesus, but for others, grandiose views of self, unfair expectations, and trivial worries do far more damage to a life of discipleship than anything else. Some of us need to let go of possessions, but others have too strong a grip on safety nets, past traumas, or grudges to be free enough to follow Jesus. Truly, nothing is too small or too insignificant. Anything that prevents us from following Jesus with our whole heart, anything that holds us back, is a stumbling block to Christian discipleship as deadly as sin. If we refuse to let go of whatever it is, we run the risk of ending up just like the rich young man: sad and far from Jesus." ...from the book Let Go: Seven Stumbling Blocks to Christian Discipleship by Casey Cole, OFM

Make the most of this spiritual spring cleaning and time out. Lent is serious, but it doesn't have to be gloomy. The grace and peace that will follow our efforts are God's gift to us.
