Hearing devices are available for use during Mass. Please ask an usher for assistance.



Believe it or not Lent is here! So now what to do? What should change? What NEEDS to change? If you are not giving up something, are you going to DO something that can be helpful and life changing to make you a better Christian? There is so much to do that can be relatively easy as long a you make the commitment, just like anything we make a priority. Even if you commit 6 minutes a day it will make a difference in your life.

You will find in this bulletin a page with a number of things you can do, some of which can be done simply in your house whenever you want!! I am talking about FORMED, a great website filled with great movies, documentaries, lectures, music, bible studies and much more. And Star of the Sea has made it FREE for you!

As I mentioned last week, in the busy-ness of your day and evening, you don't have to come to church for enrichment or study. If you are embarrassed you might be little short of your knowledge of scripture, faith, or understanding Church doctrine, this is a great place to learn more whenever you want in the privacy of your own home! Here is what you have to do. Go to www.olsos.formed.org. If you are new to the site, simply set up your own "account" with your own login information and that's it! (If you already have an account, simply login.) You no longer have to enter a parish code because we have taken care of that for you. Once you are on the OLSOS Formed page, you will also see other items of interest that I have posted for you to enjoy. Why not check it out this week? It will only take a few minutes to set up and then you are good to go. I think you will be amazed with everything that is at your disposal...for free, provided to you by your parish!

Now that you are signed in to FORMED, go to **A Lent to Remember**. There are four wonderful videos there to help you





understand the Sacrament of Reconciliation or, as most people call it, confession. I think it will be a value for all people so that is what I am asking you to do. Take the 15 seconds to create "vour account" in FORMED and then at least watch the first video of A Lent to Remember. You can watch all the videos in one setting but it might be good to watch then one a week. Or maybe you need to go back and watch it again. It really is a good video!! (After you watch at least the first three videos, for those who wish, we will gather for a brief meeting March 6 for a little question and answer period.) While there will not be a test on the videos, I do want all parishioners to please watch them during Lent and allow the Grace of God to touch your heart in truly understanding the Sacrament of Penance.

Be sure to check out all the other resources available to you that are a free gift from your parish here at Star of the Sea.

** Just a review of what my homily mentioned last weekend and for those who did not hear my homily. The Sacrament of the Sick, or "anointing" (used to be called "extreme unction"), it is meant to be asked for, or received, at the early stages of a serious illness or prior to a serious surgery. It can be received many times in a person's life. One or the family should NOT wait until the last hour of a person's life to call for a priest to anoint the sick person because you just might be able to get a priest on such a short notice. Unlike the understanding of extreme unction, or "last rites," it does not have to be received right before a person dies. Also understand that the sacrament is for the living therefore a person is not anointed after death.

Traditionally Lenten devotions in our parishes draw attention to the suffering and death of Jesus. The most popular one is known as the Stations of the Cross.

When Jesus died on the Cross, Joseph of Arimathea asked Pilate for the body and laid it in a new tomb (Jn 19:38-42) The tomb must have been a site of commemoration for the

early Christians but because of wars and invasions it was completely lost by the early fourth century.

Then came St. Helena, mother of the first Christian Roman Emperor, Constantine. In a

dream she was told that Christ's tomb was completely covered under accumulated dirt and a pagan shrine. In 326 she traveled to Jerusalem to look for the tomb. Saint Helena had the temple destroyed and the Sepulchre uncovered. It was then she found the three crosses and through a miracle determined the True Cross. Helena and Constantine built a basilica over the Holy Sepulchre. This Church of the Holy Sepulchre is still there.

People started visiting the Holy Sepulchre in Jerusalem to walk in Jesus' footsteps. The street Jesus walked is still called Via Dolorosa, the way of pain.

The travel to Jerusalem was dangerous and expensive. And not everyone was lucky

enough to be able to make this pilgrimage which could take as long as two years. So various Church organizations built copies of the Church of the Holy Sepulchre all over Europe.

In this way the spiritual benefits of the pilgrimage to the Holy Land were available to more Christians. But it still wasn't possible for peasants to travel to another village or

town for this indulgenced devotion.

The Franciscans then began putting up crosses in parish churches everywhere for this indulgenced devotion.

The number of the stations varied from five to twenty. In 1731, Pope Clement XII fixed the number of stations at fourteen and permitted indulgenced stations to be erected in every church.

What began as a dangerous pilgrimage to the Holy Land has become a devotion that can be followed easily.

Here at Star we can walk our own via dolorosa and pray together the Way of the Cross every Friday evening during Lent.
